## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the licensing and regulation of neurodiagnostic
3	technologists; requiring an occupational license; creating an
4	offense; providing penalties and authorizing fees.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subtitle K, Title 3, Occupations Code, is
7	amended by adding Chapter 606 to read as follows:
8	CHAPTER 606. NEURODIAGNOSTIC TECHNOLOGISTS
9	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS
10	Sec. 606.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
11	(1) "Autonomic reflex testing" means a test used to
12	measure how autonomic nerves work in controlling involuntary body
13	functions, including blood pressure, heart rate, and sweating, in
14	response to different maneuvers, such as deep breathing, blowing
15	into a mouthpiece, sweating, and lying for several minutes on a
16	table that is tilted to a near standing position.
17	(2) "Commission" means the Texas Commission of
18	Licensing and Regulation.
19	(3) "Credentialing organization" means a national
20	accrediting organization that administers and awards
21	neurodiagnostic technologist credentials, including the:
22	(A) ABRET Neurodiagnostic Credentialing and
23	Accreditation (ABRET);
24	(B) American Association of Electrodiagnostic

1 Technologists (AAET); 2 (C) American Board of Electrodiagnostic Medicine 3 (ABEM); or 4 (D) Board of Registered Polysomnographic 5 Technologists (BRPT). (4) "Department" means the Texas Department 6 Licensing and Regulation. 7 (5) "Direct supervision" means supervision by a 8 responsible neurodiagnostic technologist or physician who is 9 10 physically present and immediately available to provide assistance and direction while a neurodiagnostic procedure is being performed. 11 (6) "Electroencephalography" means the recording and 12 analysis of the ongoing electrical activity of the brain using a 13 digital or analog instrument with a minimum of 16 channels and 21 14 electrodes and is used to assist in the diagnosis of epilepsy and 15 16 other neurological symptoms. 17 (7) "Electromyography" means the recording and analysis of electrical activity generated by a needle insertion 18 19 into a muscle. "Evoked potentials" means the recording of 20 (8) electrical activity from the brain, spinal nerves, or sensory 21 22 receptors that occurs in direct response to auditory, visual, or electrical stimulation using surface electrodes and computer 23

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(9) "Executive director" means the executive director

(10) "General supervision" means supervision by a

- 3 (11) "Intraoperative monitoring" means the use of a
- 4 neurophysiological monitoring technique during surgery that
- 5 ensures the safety of a patient by:
- 6 (A) providing information to the surgeon that
- 7 relates to the integrity of the central and peripheral nervous
- 8 systems; and
- 9 (B) using real-time electrographic information
- 10 or stimulus evoked recordings of auditory, visual, somatosensory,
- 11 or motor pathways via surface or subdermal needle electrodes.
- 12 (12) "License holder" means a person who holds a
- 13 license as a neurodiagnostic technologist under this chapter.
- 14 (13) "Long-term monitoring" means the prolonged
- 15 recording, by video recording or digital analysis, of the ongoing
- 16 <u>electrical activity of the brain to evaluate and diagnose epilepsy</u>
- 17 and other intermittent or infrequent neurological disturbances.
- 18 (14) "Nerve conduction study" means a recording
- 19 obtained from electrical stimulation of peripheral nerves using
- 20 surface electrodes and standard equipment with oscilloscopes for
- 21 waveform analysis to evaluate and diagnose a disorder of the
- 22 peripheral nervous system.
- 23 (15) "Neurodiagnostic student" means a person who is
- 24 enrolled in a neurodiagnostics program.
- 25 (16) "Neurodiagnostic technologist" means a person
- 26 who holds a license issued under this chapter to:
- (A) use specialized equipment to record and

1	analyze physiological data and electrical activity from the central
2	and peripheral nervous systems; and
3	(B) perform one or more of the following
4	neurodiagnostic procedures under the direct or general supervision
5	of a physician:
6	(i) electroencephalography;
7	(ii) evoked potentials;
8	(iii) continuous electroencephalography
9	monitoring;
10	(iv) intraoperative neuromonitoring;
11	<pre>(v) long-term monitoring;</pre>
12	(vi) nerve conduction studies;
13	(vii) polysomnography; or
14	(viii) autonomic reflex testing.
15	(17) "Polysomnography" means the recording of the
16	biophysiological changes that occur during sleep by monitoring the
17	ongoing electrical activity of the brain, eye movements, muscle
18	activity, heart rhythm, and respiratory effort to diagnose and
19	treat sleep disorders.
20	Sec. 606.002. EXEMPTIONS. This chapter does not apply to:
21	(1) a physician licensed in this state;
22	(2) a person performing a neurodiagnostic procedure:
23	(A) for research if the results of the procedure
24	are not used to diagnose or treat a patient;
25	(B) as a neurodiagnostic student under the direct
26	supervision of a neurodiagnostic technologist or physician; or
27	(C) as an employee under the direct supervision

- of a physician as part of the employee's job training; or
- 2 (3) a faculty member of an accredited school or
- 3 university with a neurodiagnostics, allied health, or health
- 4 education program.
- 5 SUBCHAPTER B. POWERS AND DUTIES OF COMMISSION AND DEPARTMENT
- 6 Sec. 606.051. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES; RULES. (a) The
- 7 department shall administer and enforce this chapter.
- 8 <u>(b) The commission shall adopt rules necessary to</u>
- 9 administer and enforce this chapter.
- 10 (c) In its rules under this section, the commission shall
- 11 list the specific offenses for which a conviction would constitute
- 12 grounds for the commission to take action under Chapter 53.
- Sec. 606.052. FEES. (a) The commission by rule shall
- 14 establish reasonable and necessary fees in amounts sufficient to
- 15 cover the costs of administering and enforcing this chapter.
- 16 (b) The commission may increase the fee for the issuance or
- 17 renewal of a license as necessary to cover the costs of enforcing
- 18 this chapter in an amount not to exceed \$1,000.
- 19 SUBCHAPTER C. LICENSE REQUIREMENTS
- Sec. 606.101. LICENSE REQUIRED. (a) A person may not act
- 21 as or offer to act as a neurodiagnostic technologist unless the
- 22 person holds a license issued under this chapter.
- 23 (b) A person who is not licensed under this chapter, or
- 24 whose license has been suspended or revoked, may not:
- 25 (1) use the word "neurodiagnostic" on a sign, name
- 26 tag, or any form of advertising unless the person is expressly
- 27 exempt from the licensing requirements of this chapter;

- 1 (2) use in connection with the person's practice any
- 2 abbreviations or credentials indicating or implying that the person
- 3 is a neurodiagnostic technologist; or
- 4 (3) directly or by implication represent in any way
- 5 that the person is a neurodiagnostic technologist.
- 6 (c) A license:
- 7 (1) is valid only with respect to the person named on
- 8 the license; and
- 9 (2) authorizes the license holder to engage in the
- 10 neurodiagnostic procedure for which the license holder has a
- 11 credential issued by a credentialing organization.
- 12 (d) A license issued under this chapter is not transferable
- 13 or assignable.
- 14 Sec. 606.102. LICENSING APPLICATION. (a) An applicant for
- 15 a license must:
- 16 (1) apply to the department on a form prescribed by the
- 17 executive director and under rules adopted by the commission;
- 18 (2) submit with the application a nonrefundable
- 19 application fee in an amount set by the commission; and
- 20 (3) pass a credentialing organization examination
- 21 administered or accepted by the department.
- 22 (b) The commission by rule shall specify the information
- 23 that must be included on an application submitted to the
- 24 department. The rules must require:
- 25 (1) each application to include the name and address
- 26 of the applicant; and
- 27 (2) each applicant for a license by examination to

- 1 present satisfactory evidence to the commission that the applicant
- 2 is:
- 3 (A) at least 18 years of age; and
- 4 (B) of good moral character.
- 5 Sec. 606.103. EXAMINATIONS ADMINISTERED OR ACCEPTED BY
- 6 DEPARTMENT. The department may administer or accept for licensing
- 7 a credentialing organization examination as determined by rule.
- 8 Sec. 606.1031. REDUCED LICENSE REQUIREMENTS. (a) A person
- 9 who applies for a license under this chapter not later than June 1,
- 10 2016, is exempt from the examination required under this chapter if
- 11 the person presents satisfactory evidence to the department that
- 12 the person:
- 13 (1) holds unexpired credentials issued by a
- 14 credentialing organization; or
- 15 (2) actively performs neurodiagnostic procedures.
- 16 (b) Satisfactory evidence under Subsection (a)(2) must be
- 17 in the form of a signed letter submitted by the employer or
- 18 supervising physician of the applicant.
- 19 (c) A person who qualifies under this section for an
- 20 exemption from the requirement to take the examination required
- 21 under this chapter must comply with all other requirements under
- 22 this chapter for issuance of a license.
- 23 (d) This section expires June 1, 2017.
- Sec. 606.104. TEMPORARY LICENSES. (a) The commission may
- 25 adopt rules and set fees relating to granting temporary licenses.
- 26 (b) A temporary license under this chapter expires on the
- 27 second anniversary of the date the temporary license is issued or

- 1 the date the applicant presents satisfactory evidence to the
- 2 department that the applicant has passed the examination required
- 3 under this chapter, whichever date occurs first.
- 4 (c) The commission by rule may extend the expiration date of
- 5 a temporary license by not more than an additional 12 months.
- 6 SUBCHAPTER D. LICENSE RENEWAL
- 7 Sec. 606.151. LICENSE RENEWAL. (a) A license is valid for
- 8 two years from the date of issuance and may be renewed biennially.
- 9 (b) The commission by rule may adopt a system under which
- 10 licenses expire on various dates during the year.
- 11 (c) A person may renew an unexpired license by paying the
- 12 required renewal fee to the department before the license
- 13 expiration date.
- 14 (d) To renew a license under this chapter, a person must
- 15 submit proof satisfactory to the department that the person has:
- 16 (1) maintained the appropriate credentials issued by a
- 17 credentialing organization; and
- 18 (2) complied with the continuing education
- 19 requirements prescribed by the commission.
- Sec. 606.152. CONTINUING EDUCATION. (a) The commission
- 21 shall establish for the renewal of a license or temporary license
- 22 uniform continuing education requirements of not less than 24
- 23 continuing education hours for each renewal period.
- 24 (b) The commission shall adopt a procedure to assess a
- 25 license holder's participation in continuing education programs.
- SUBCHAPTER E. PRACTICE BY LICENSE HOLDER
- Sec. 606.201. ADVERTISING. (a) A license holder shall

- 1 <u>include the license holder's license number in each advertisement.</u>
- 2 (b) A person who advertises that the person is a
- 3 neurodiagnostic technologist is presumed to be engaging in conduct
- 4 regulated by this chapter.
- 5 SUBCHAPTER F. PROHIBITED PRACTICES AND ENFORCEMENT PROVISIONS
- 6 Sec. 606.251. PROHIBITED PRACTICES. (a) A license holder
- 7 may not engage in a neurodiagnostic procedure for which the license
- 8 holder does not hold the proper credential issued by a
- 9 credentialing organization.
- 10 (b) A license holder may not:
- 11 (1) interpret neurodiagnostic data, including making
- 12 a determination of normal or abnormal findings and identifying the
- 13 presence, absence, type, severity, or likelihood of an illness,
- 14 injury, or other condition;
- 15 (2) provide clinical correlation of data, including
- 16 making statements about the meaning of test results based on a
- 17 person's symptoms, medical history, physical examination, or other
- 18 clinical test results; or
- 19 (3) perform needle insertion electromyography in a
- 20 <u>clin</u>ical setting.
- Sec. 606.252. INVESTIGATION OF COMPLAINTS. (a) The
- 22 department shall investigate any complaint alleging that a
- 23 violation of this chapter or a rule or order adopted under this
- 24 chapter has occurred.
- 25 (b) A complaint must be filed in a manner prescribed by the
- 26 department.
- Sec. 606.253. SANCTIONS. The commission may impose

- 1 sanctions as provided by Sections 51.352 and 51.353.
- 2 SUBCHAPTER G. PENALTIES
- 3 Sec. 606.301. ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTY. The commission or
- 4 executive director may impose an administrative penalty on a person
- 5 under Subchapter F, Chapter 51, regardless of whether the person
- 6 holds a license under this chapter, if the person violates this
- 7 chapter or a rule or order adopted under this chapter.
- 8 Sec. 606.302. CRIMINAL PENALTY. (a) A person commits an
- 9 offense if the person violates this chapter.
- 10 (b) An offense under this section is a Class A misdemeanor.
- 11 SECTION 2. Not later than February 1, 2016, the Texas
- 12 Commission of Licensing and Regulation, the Texas Department of
- 13 Licensing and Regulation, and the executive director of the Texas
- 14 Department of Licensing and Regulation, as appropriate, shall adopt
- 15 rules and forms necessary to implement Chapter 606, Occupations
- 16 Code, as added by this Act.
- 17 SECTION 3. The Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation
- 18 shall issue a neurodiagnostic technologist license under Chapter
- 19 606, Occupations Code, as added by this Act, to an applicant who:
- 20 (1) applies for a license under this section not later
- 21 than June 1, 2016;
- 22 (2) submits to the department the information required
- 23 by rule;
- 24 (3) meets the requirements of Section 606.1031,
- 25 Occupations Code, as added by this Act; and
- 26 (4) pays the application fee established by the
- 27 commission.

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- 1 SECTION 4. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of this
- 2 section, this Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
- 3 (b) Section 606.101 and Subchapter G, Chapter 606,
- 4 Occupations Code, as added by this Act, take effect September 1,
- 5 2016.
