- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 8 SECTION 1. Chapter 56, Education Code, is amended by adding
- 9 Subchapter U to read as follows:
- 10 SUBCHAPTER U. TEXAS COMPETENCY-BASED EDUCATION GRANT PROGRAM
- Sec. 56.601. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
- 12 <u>(1) "Coordinating board" means the Texas Higher</u>
- 13 Education Coordinating Board.
- 14 (2) "Eligible institution" means a nonprofit,
- 15 tax-exempt, regionally accredited college or university located in
- 16 this state that offers competency-based online or other distance
- 17 education.

- 18 (3) "Expected family contribution" means the amount of
- 19 <u>discretionary income that should be available to a student from the</u>
- 20 resources of the student and of the student's family, as determined
- 21 by the coordinating board following the methodology prescribed by
- 22 the United States Department of Education for the purpose of
- 23 determining a student's eligibility for need-based student
- 24 financial assistance.

- 1 (4) "General academic teaching institution" has the
- 2 meaning assigned by Section 61.003.
- 3 (5) "Program" means the Texas Competency-Based
- 4 Education Grant Program established under this subchapter.
- 5 Sec. 56.602. PURPOSE. The purpose of the Texas
- 6 Competency-Based Education Grant Program is to provide financial
- 7 assistance to enable eligible students to enroll in
- 8 competency-based online or other distance education baccalaureate
- 9 degree programs at eligible institutions.
- 10 Sec. 56.603. ADMINISTRATION OF PROGRAM; PRIORITY FOR
- 11 FINANCIAL NEED. (a) The coordinating board shall administer the
- 12 program and adopt any rules necessary to implement the program or
- 13 this subchapter. The coordinating board shall consult with the
- 14 student financial aid officers of eligible institutions in
- 15 developing the rules.
- 16 (b) The total amount of grants awarded under the program may
- 17 not exceed the amount available for the program from
- 18 appropriations, gifts, grants, or other funds.
- 19 (c) In determining who should receive a grant under the
- 20 program, the coordinating board and the eligible institutions shall
- 21 give highest priority to awarding grants to students who
- 22 demonstrate the greatest financial need.
- Sec. 56.604. INITIAL ELIGIBILITY FOR GRANT. (a) To be
- 24 eligible initially for a grant under the program, a person must:
- 25 (1) be a resident of this state as determined by
- 26 coordinating board rules;
- 27 (2) meet financial need requirements as defined by

- 1 coordinating board rules, including a requirement that the person's
- 2 expected family contribution for the academic year does not exceed
- 3 the maximum expected family contribution established for this
- 4 purpose by the coordinating board;
- 5 (3) be enrolled in a competency-based online or other
- 6 <u>distance education baccalaureate degree program at an eligible</u>
- 7 <u>institution;</u>
- 8 (4) not be receiving a grant or other gift aid under
- 9 any other state financial aid grant program for the same academic
- 10 period; and
- 11 (5) comply with any additional nonacademic
- 12 requirement adopted by the coordinating board under this
- 13 subchapter.
- 14 (b) A person is not eligible to receive a grant under the
- 15 program if the person has been granted a baccalaureate degree.
- 16 (c) A person's eligibility for a grant under the program
- 17 ends on the earliest of the following dates:
- 18 (1) the fourth anniversary of the initial award of a
- 19 grant under the program to the person and the person's enrollment in
- 20 an eligible institution, if at the time of the initial award the
- 21 person had earned less than 60 semester credit hours or an
- 22 <u>equivalent number of competency units or credits toward the</u>
- 23 person's degree;
- 24 (2) the second anniversary of the initial award of a
- 25 grant under the program to the person and the person's enrollment in
- 26 an eligible institution, if at the time of the initial award the
- 27 person had earned 60 or more semester credit hours or an equivalent

- 1 number of competency units or credits toward the person's degree;
- 2 or
- 3 (3) the date the person receives a baccalaureate
- 4 degree.
- 5 Sec. 56.605. CONTINUING ELIGIBILITY AND ACADEMIC
- 6 PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS. (a) After initially qualifying for a
- 7 grant under the program, a person may continue to receive a grant
- 8 under the program during each semester or term in which the person
- 9 is enrolled at an eligible institution only if the person:
- 10 (1) meets the criteria for initial eligibility under
- 11 Section 56.604(a);
- 12 (2) makes satisfactory academic progress toward a
- 13 baccalaureate degree; and
- 14 (3) complies with any additional nonacademic
- 15 requirement adopted by the coordinating board.
- 16 (b) If a person fails to meet any of the requirements of
- 17 Subsection (a) after the completion of any semester or term, the
- 18 person may not receive a grant under the program during the next
- 19 semester or term in which the person enrolls. Unless the person's
- 20 eligibility for a grant expires under Section 56.604(c), a person
- 21 may become eligible to receive a grant under the program in a
- 22 <u>subsequent semester or term if the person:</u>
- 23 (1) completes at least 15 semester credit hours or an
- 24 equivalent number of competency units or credits in a semester or
- 25 term during which the student is not eligible for a grant; and
- 26 (2) meets all the requirements of Subsection (a).
- 27 (c) For the purpose of this section, a person makes

- 1 satisfactory academic progress toward a baccalaureate degree only
- 2 if the person completes at least 15 semester credit hours or an
- 3 equivalent number of competency units or credits in each semester
- 4 or term in which the person is enrolled.
- 5 (d) The coordinating board shall adopt rules to allow a
- 6 person who is otherwise eligible to receive a grant under the
- 7 program to receive a grant if the student's completion rate falls
- 8 below the satisfactory academic progress requirements of this
- 9 section in the event of a hardship or for other good cause shown,
- 10 including:
- 11 (1) a showing of a severe illness or other
- 12 debilitating condition that may affect the person's academic
- 13 performance; or
- 14 (2) a showing that the person is responsible for the
- 15 care of a sick, injured, or needy person and that the person's
- 16 provision of care may affect the person's academic performance.
- 17 Sec. 56.606. GRANT USE. A person receiving a grant under
- 18 the program may use the money to pay any usual and customary cost of
- 19 attendance at an eligible institution incurred by the student. The
- 20 institution may disburse all or part of the proceeds of a grant
- 21 under the program to an eligible person only if the tuition and
- 22 required fees incurred by the person at the institution have been
- 23 <u>paid.</u>
- Sec. 56.607. GRANT AMOUNT. (a) The maximum annual amount
- 25 of a grant under the program for a full-time undergraduate student
- 26 equivalent enrolled at an eligible institution is an amount equal
- 27 to 75 percent of the average state appropriation for the state

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- 1 fiscal biennium preceding the biennium in which the grant is
- 2 awarded for a full-time undergraduate student equivalent enrolled
- 3 at a general academic teaching institution, as determined by the
- 4 coordinating board.
- 5 (b) The coordinating board may adopt rules that allow the
- 6 coordinating board to increase or decrease, in proportion to the
- 7 number of semester credit hours or competency units or credits in
- 8 which a student is enrolled, the amount of a grant award to a
- 9 student who is enrolled in a number of semester credit hours or
- 10 competency units or credits in excess of or below 15 semester credit
- 11 hours or an equivalent number of competency units or credits.
- 12 Sec. 56.608. GRANT NOT TO AFFECT ADMISSION. An eligible
- 13 <u>institution may not deny admission to or enrollment in the</u>
- 14 <u>institution based on a person's eligibility to receive a grant</u>
- 15 under the program or a person's receipt of a grant under the
- 16 program.
- 17 SECTION 2. (a) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating
- 18 Board shall adopt rules to administer Subchapter U, Chapter 56,
- 19 Education Code, as added by this Act, as soon as practicable after
- 20 the effective date of this Act. For that purpose, the coordinating
- 21 board may adopt the initial rules in the manner provided by law for
- 22 emergency rules.
- 23 (b) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall
- 24 begin awarding scholarships under Subchapter U, Chapter 56,
- 25 Education Code, as added by this Act, for the first academic year
- 26 for which money is appropriated for that purpose, except that the
- 27 coordinating board may not award grants under that subchapter for

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- 1 an academic year before the 2016-2017 academic year.
- 2 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 3 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 4 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 5 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 6 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
