## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the prosecution of the offense of failure to identify;
- 3 creating a criminal offense.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 38.02(a), Penal Code, is amended to read 6 as follows:
- 7 (a) A person commits an offense if the person [he]
- 8 intentionally refuses to give  $\underline{\text{the person's}}$  [ $\underline{\text{his}}$ ] name, residence
- 9 address, or date of birth to a peace officer who has [lawfully
- 10 arrested the person and] requested the information from the person
- 11 and:
- 12 (1) has lawfully arrested the person;
- 13 (2) has lawfully detained the person; or
- 14 (3) has good cause to believe that the person is a
- 15 witness to a criminal offense.
- 16 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 17 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 18 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 19 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed,
- 20 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 21 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 22 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred
- 23 before that date.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
