A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the procedures for applying for a ballot to be voted by

- 3 mail; affecting the prosecution of a criminal offense.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 84.001(e), Election Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (e) An applicant for a ballot to be voted by mail may apply
- 8 for ballots for the main election and any resulting runoff election
- 9 on the same application. If an [The timeliness of the application
- 10 for both elections is determined in relation to the main election.
- 11 However, if the application for the main election and any
- 12 <u>resulting runoff</u> is not timely for the main election, <u>it will be</u>
- 13 considered timely for any resulting runoff if received not later
- 14 than the deadline, determined using the date of the runoff
- 15 election, for submitting a regular application for a ballot to be
- 16 voted by mail [the timeliness of the application for the runoff
- 17 election is determined in relation to that election].
- SECTION 2. Section 84.004(a), Election Code, is amended to
- 19 read as follows:
- 20 (a) A person commits an offense if:
- 21 (1) [, in the same election,] the person signs an
- 22 [early voting ballot] application for a ballot to be voted by mail
- 23 as a witness for more than one applicant in the same election; or
- 24 (2) the person signs an annual application for a

- 1 ballot to be voted by mail as a witness for more than one applicant
- 2 in the same calendar year.
- 3 SECTION 3. Section 84.007(c), Election Code, is amended to
- 4 read as follows:
- 5 (c) Except as provided by Section 86.0015, an [An]
- 6 application must be submitted on or after the 60th day before
- 7 election day and before the close of regular business in the early
- 8 voting clerk's office or 12 noon, whichever is later, on the 11th
- 9 [ninth] day before election day unless that day is a Saturday,
- 10 Sunday, or legal state or national holiday, in which case the last
- 11 day is the first preceding regular business day.
- 12 SECTION 4. Section 84.011(a), Election Code, is amended to
- 13 read as follows:
- 14 (a) The officially prescribed application form for an early
- 15 voting ballot must include:
- 16 (1) immediately preceding the signature space the
- 17 statement: "I certify that the information given in this
- 18 application is true, and I understand that giving false information
- 19 in this application is a crime.";
- 20 (2) a statement informing the applicant of the
- 21 offenses prescribed by Sections 84.003 and 84.004;
- 22 (3) spaces for entering an applicant's voter
- 23 registration number and county election precinct of registration,
- 24 with a statement informing the applicant that failure to furnish
- 25 that information does not invalidate the application; and
- 26 (4) on an application for a ballot to be voted by mail:
- 27 (A) a space for an applicant applying on the

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- 1 ground of absence from the county of residence to indicate the date
- 2 on or after which the applicant can receive mail at the address
- 3 outside the county;
- 4 (B) a space for indicating the fact that an
- 5 applicant whose application is signed by a witness cannot make the
- 6 applicant's mark and a space for indicating the relationship or
- 7 lack of relationship of the witness to the applicant;
- 8 (C) a space for entering an applicant's telephone
- 9 number, with a statement informing the applicant that failure to
- 10 furnish that information does not invalidate the application;
- 11 (D) a space or box for an applicant applying on
- 12 the ground of age or disability to indicate that the address to
- 13 which the ballot is to be mailed is the address of a facility or
- 14 relative described by Section 84.002(a)(3), if applicable;
- 15 (E) a space or box for an applicant applying on
- 16 the ground of confinement in jail to indicate that the address to
- 17 which the ballot is to be mailed is the address of a relative
- 18 described by Section 84.002(a)(4), if applicable;
- 19 (F) a space for an applicant applying on the
- 20 ground of age or disability to indicate if the application is an
- 21 <u>annual application under Section 86.0015;</u>
- 22 <u>(G)</u> spaces for entering the signature, printed
- 23 name, and residence address of any person assisting the applicant;
- (H) $[\frac{(G)}{(G)}]$ a statement informing the applicant of
- 25 the condition prescribed by Section 81.005; and
- (I) $[\frac{H}{H}]$ a statement informing the applicant of
- 27 the requirement prescribed by Section 86.003(c).

- 1 SECTION 5. The heading to Section 86.0015, Election Code,
- 2 is amended to read as follows:
- 3 Sec. 86.0015. ANNUAL [APPLYING FOR MORE THAN ONE ELECTION
- 4 IN SAME] APPLICATION FOR BALLOT BY MAIL.
- 5 SECTION 6. Section 86.0015, Election Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsections (a) and (b) and adding Subsections (b-1),
- 7 (b-2), and (e) to read as follows:
- 8 (a) This section applies only to an application for a ballot
- 9 to be voted by mail that:
- 10 (1) is submitted to the county clerk indicating the
- 11 ground of eligibility is age or disability; and
- 12 (2) does not specify the election for which a ballot is
- 13 requested or has been marked by the applicant as an annual
- 14 application.
- 15 (b) An application described by Subsection (a) is
- 16 considered to be an application for a ballot for each election in
- 17 which the county clerk serves as early voting clerk and:
- 18 (1) in which the applicant is eligible to vote; and
- 19 (2) that occurs before the earlier of:
- 20 (A) except as provided by Subsection (b-1), the
- 21 end of the calendar year in which the application was submitted;
- 22 [or]
- 23 (B) the date the county clerk receives notice
- 24 from the voter registrar [under Subsection (d)] that the voter has
- 25 submitted a change in registration information relating to the
- 26 voter's registration address; or
- (C) the date the voter's registration is

- 1 <u>canceled</u>.
- 2 (b-1) An application submitted under this section must be
- 3 submitted before the close of regular business in the early voting
- 4 clerk's office or 12 noon, whichever is later, on the 11th day
- 5 before election day unless that day is a Saturday, Sunday, or legal
- 6 state or national holiday, in which case the last day is the first
- 7 preceding regular business day.
- 8 (b-2) An application is considered to be submitted in the
- 9 following calendar year for purposes of this section if:
- 10 (1) the applicant is eligible to vote in an election
- 11 occurring in January or February of the next calendar year; and
- 12 (2) the application is submitted in the last 60 days of
- 13 <u>a calendar year but not earlier than the 60th day before the date of</u>
- 14 the January or February election.
- 15 <u>(e) The early voting clerk shall notify a voter if the voter</u>
- 16 <u>is found to be no longer eligible for a ballot by mail under this</u>
- 17 section for a reason described by Subsection (b)(2)(B) or (C).
- SECTION 7. Not later than January 1, 2016, the secretary of
- 19 state shall make the modifications to the official application form
- 20 for a ballot to be voted early by mail, as required by Section
- 21 84.011(a), Election Code, as modified by this Act.
- 22 SECTION 8. This Act applies only to an application for a
- 23 ballot to be voted by mail submitted on or after January 1, 2016.
- 24 SECTION 9. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 25 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 26 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 27 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

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1 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
