Section 84.001(e), Election Code, is amended to 5 read as follows: 6 7 (e) An applicant for a ballot to be voted by mail may apply for ballots for the main election and any resulting runoff election 8 on the same application. If an [The timeliness of the application 9 for both elections is determined in relation to the main election. 10 However, if the] application for the main election and any 11 resulting runoff is not timely for the main election, it will be 12 considered timely for any resulting runoff if received not later 13 than the deadline, determined using the date of the runoff 14 election, for submitting a regular application for a ballot to be 15 16 voted by mail [the timeliness of the application for the runoff election is determined in relation to that election]. 17 SECTION 2. Section 84.004(a), Election Code, is amended to 18 read as follows: 19 20 (a) A person commits an offense if : 21 $[\frac{1}{7}$ in the same election,] the person signs an (1) [early voting ballot] application for a ballot to be voted by mail 22 23 as a witness for more than one applicant in the same election; or 24 (2) the person signs an annual application for a

ballot to be voted by mail as a witness for more than one applicant
 in the same calendar year.

3 SECTION 3. Section 84.007(c), Election Code, is amended to 4 read as follows:

5 Except as provided by Section 86.0015, an (c) [An] application must be submitted on or after the 60th day before 6 election day and before the close of regular business in the early 7 8 voting clerk's office or 12 noon, whichever is later, on the 11th [ninth] day before election day unless that day is a Saturday, 9 10 Sunday, or legal state or national holiday, in which case the last day is the first preceding regular business day. 11

SECTION 4. Section 84.011(a), Election Code, is amended to read as follows:

14 (a) The officially prescribed application form for an early15 voting ballot must include:

16 (1) immediately preceding the signature space the 17 statement: "I certify that the information given in this 18 application is true, and I understand that giving false information 19 in this application is a crime.";

(2) a statement informing the applicant of the
offenses prescribed by Sections 84.003 and 84.004;

(3) spaces for entering an applicant's voter
registration number and county election precinct of registration,
with a statement informing the applicant that failure to furnish
that information does not invalidate the application; and

27 (A) a space for an applicant applying on the

(B) a space for indicating the fact that an
applicant whose application is signed by a witness cannot make the
applicant's mark and a space for indicating the relationship or
lack of relationship of the witness to the applicant;

8 (C) a space for entering an applicant's telephone 9 number, with a statement informing the applicant that failure to 10 furnish that information does not invalidate the application;

(D) a space or box for an applicant applying on the ground of age or disability to indicate that the address to which the ballot is to be mailed is the address of a facility or relative described by Section 84.002(a)(3), if applicable;

(E) a space or box for an applicant applying on the ground of confinement in jail to indicate that the address to which the ballot is to be mailed is the address of a relative described by Section 84.002(a)(4), if applicable;

(F) <u>a space for an applicant applying on the</u> ground of age or disability to indicate if the application is an annual application under Section 86.0015;

SECTION 5. The heading to Section 86.0015, Election Code,
 is amended to read as follows:

3 Sec. 86.0015. <u>ANNUAL</u> [APPLYING FOR MORE THAN ONE ELECTION 4 IN SAME] APPLICATION FOR BALLOT BY MAIL.

5 SECTION 6. Section 86.0015, Election Code, is amended by 6 amending Subsections (a) and (b) and adding Subsections (b-1) and 7 (b-2) to read as follows:

8 (a) This section applies only to an application for a ballot9 to be voted by mail that:

10 (1) is submitted to the county clerk indicating the 11 ground of eligibility is age or disability; and

12 (2) does not specify the election for which a ballot is
13 requested <u>or has been marked by the applicant as an annual</u>
14 <u>application</u>.

(b) An application described by Subsection (a) is considered to be an application for a ballot for each election in which the county clerk serves as early voting clerk and:

18 (1) in which the applicant is eligible to vote; and
19 (2) that occurs before the earlier of:

20 (A) <u>except as provided by Subsection (b-1)</u>, the 21 end of the calendar year in which the application was submitted; 22 [or]

(B) the date the county clerk receives notice from the voter registrar [under Subsection (d)] that the voter has submitted a change in registration information <u>relating to the</u> <u>voter's registration address; or</u>

2 (b-1) An application submitted under this section is
3 subject to the same deadline for submittal as a regular application
4 for a ballot to be voted by mail under Section 84.007(c).

5 (b-2) An application submitted in the last 60 days of a 6 calendar year is considered to be submitted in the next calendar 7 year for purposes of this section if:

8 (1) the applicant is eligible to vote in an election 9 occurring in January or February of the next calendar year; and

10 (2) the application is submitted after the earliest 11 date for submitting a regular application for a ballot to be voted 12 by mail under Section 84.007(c).

13 SECTION 7. Not later than January 1, 2016, the secretary of 14 state shall make the modifications to the official application form 15 for a ballot to be voted early by mail, as required by Section 16 84.011(a), Election Code, as modified by this Act.

17 SECTION 8. This Act applies only to an application for a 18 ballot to be voted by mail submitted on or after January 1, 2016.

19 SECTION 9. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 23 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
