4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 1002, Texas Health and
6	Safety Code, is amended by adding Sec. 1002.001(13) and Sec.
7	1002.001 (14) to read as follows:
8	(13) "Health Literacy" means the degree to which
9	individuals have the capacity to obtain, communicate, process, and
10	understand basic health information and services to make
11	appropriate health decisions in the treatment, payment, or
12	coverage of care while successfully navigating complex health care
13	systems.
14	(14) "Task Force" means the Multi-Stakeholder
15	Taskforce on Health Literacy
16	SECTION 2. Chapter 1002, Texas Health and Safety Code, is
17	amended by adding <u>Subchapter F. HEALTH LITERACY</u> to read as follows:
18	Sec. 1002.203. MULTI-STAKEHOLDER TASKFORCE ON HEALTH
19	LITERACY. (a) Not later than December 1, 2015, the Texas Institute
20	of Health Care Quality & Efficiency shall establish the task force
21	to
22	(b) Establish a broad definition of health literacy, to
23	include a focus on the patient's need for transparent information
24	about health care cost, quality, and treatment options.

10	(c) The chair of the board shall appoint a lead and
11	vice-lead to facilitate taskforce activities.
12	(d) The taskforce may consult with and invite participation
13	from other groups, organizations, and agencies as needed.
14	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
