A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to mandating a study by the state comptroller on
3	procurement consolidation of all state agencies in state
4	government.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 403, Government Code, is
7	amended by adding Section 403.03057 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 403.03057. CENTRALIZED STATE PROCUREMENT STUDY. (a)
9	The comptroller in cooperation with the Governor's Office of
10	Budget, Planning, and Policy shall conduct a study examining the
11	feasibility and practicability of streamlining and consolidating
12	state purchasing and procurement into either fewer offices
13	departments or agencies; or one office, department, or agency. The
14	study must examine the extent to which cost savings to the state can
15	be achieved through:
16	(1) the removal of certain offices and departments for
17	each agency that currently possesses a dedicated department for
18	<pre>purchasing and procurement; and</pre>
19	(2) the consolidation or reduction of the number of
20	state vendors by which the state can leverage its purchasing power.
21	(b) The comptroller shall prepare and deliver to the
22	governor, the lieutenant governor, and each member of the
23	legislature a report of findings from this study that include:
24	(1) a detailed projection of expected savings or costs

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- 1 to the state resulting in consolidation of state purchasing and
- 2 procurement; and
- 3 (2) a report on the process by which the legislature or
- 4 executive branch would need to undertake in order to implement
- 5 consolidation of state purchasing and procurement;
- 6 (3) a listing of offices, departments, or agencies
- 7 <u>currently responsible for purchasing or procurement in every agency</u>
- 8 in this state; and
- 9 (4) the total cost to the state of each office,
- 10 department, or agency that is currently responsible for purchasing
- 11 or procurement in every agency in this state.
- 12 (5) The comptroller shall prepare, deliver, and post
- 13 this report not later than December 31, 2017.
- 14 (c) This section expires January 1, 2018.
- SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
