9	governing the procedures and requirements for a pharmacist to
10	dispense and deliver tobacco cessation drugs under Section 562.016,
11	including rules governing:
12	(1) the protocol for dispensing and delivering a
13	tobacco cessation drug under that section;
14	(2) the education and training a pharmacist must
15	complete to dispense and deliver a tobacco cessation drug under
16	that section;
17	(3) the specific drugs that may be dispensed and
18	delivered under that section;
19	(4) the documentation that a pharmacist must create
20	and maintain under that section; and
21	(5) the notification a pharmacist must provide to a
22	physician designated by the person receiving the tobacco cessation
23	drug, including procedures for a person receiving the tobacco
24	cessation drug who does not have an established primary care

2 SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 562, Occupations Code, is 3 amended by adding Section 562.016 to read as follows:

<u>Sec. 562.016. AUTHORITY TO DISPENSE AND DELIVER CERTAIN</u>
<u>MEDICATIONS. (a) In this section, "tobacco cessation drug" means a</u>
<u>prescription drug approved by the United States Food and Drug</u>
<u>Administration for use in the treatment of nicotine or smoking</u>
addiction.

9 (b) Notwithstanding any other law, a pharmacist may 10 dispense and deliver, without a prescription drug order, a tobacco 11 cessation drug to an individual who uses tobacco.

12 (c) A pharmacist may charge a fee for providing a 13 professional service under this section in addition to a fee 14 <u>charged for dispensing a drug.</u>

15 SECTION 3. Not later than April 1, 2016, the Texas State 16 Board of Pharmacy, with the advice of the Texas Medical Board, shall 17 adopt the rules required by Section 554.058, Occupations Code, as 18 added by this Act.

SECTION 4. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of thissection, this Act takes effect September 1, 2015.

(b) Section 562.016, Occupations Code, as added by this Act,
takes effect April 1, 2016.
