- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 54, Education Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Section 54.3532 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 54.3532. EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES PROVIDER ENROLLED
- 9 IN MEDICAL COURSES. (a) The governing board of an institution of
- 10 higher education shall exempt from the payment of tuition and
- 11 laboratory fees any student enrolled in one or more courses offered
- 12 <u>as part of a medical curriculum who:</u>
- (1) is employed by a political subdivision of this
- 14 state as an emergency medical technician certified by the
- 15 Department of State Health Services as provided by Chapter 773,
- 16 Health and Safety Code; or
- 17 (2) is currently, and has been for at least one year,
- 18 an active member of a municipal emergency medical services provider
- 19 and who holds an associate's degree as a licensed paramedic.
- 20 (b) An exemption provided under this section does not apply
- 21 to deposits that may be required in the nature of security for the
- 22 return or proper care of property loaned for the use of students.
- (c) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), a student who for a
- 24 semester or term at an institution of higher education receives an

- 1 exemption under this section may continue to receive the exemption
- 2 for a subsequent semester or term at any institution only if the
- 3 student makes satisfactory academic progress toward a degree or
- 4 certificate at that institution as determined by the institution
- 5 for purposes of financial aid.
- 6 (d) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), the exemption provided
- 7 under this section does not apply to any amount of additional
- 8 tuition the institution elects to charge a resident undergraduate
- 9 student under Section 54.014(a) or (f).
- 10 (e) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), the exemption provided
- 11 under this section does not apply to any amount of tuition the
- 12 institution charges a graduate student in excess of the amount of
- 13 tuition charged to similarly situated graduate students because the
- 14 student has a number of semester credit hours of doctoral work in
- 15 excess of the applicable number provided by Section 61.059(1)(1) or
- 16 <u>(2)</u>.
- 17 (f) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall
- 18 adopt:
- 19 (1) rules governing the granting or denial of an
- 20 exemption under this section, including rules relating to the
- 21 determination of a student's eligibility for an exemption; and
- 22 (2) a uniform listing of degree programs covered by
- 23 the exemption under this section.
- SECTION 2. Section 54.3532, Education Code, as added by
- 25 this Act, applies beginning with tuition and laboratory fees
- 26 charged for the 2015 fall semester. Tuition and laboratory fees
- 27 charged for an academic period before that semester are covered by

- 1 the law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act,
- 2 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
