Section 31.03 (e)(6), Penal Code is amended to 6 read as follows: 7 (6) a felony of the second degree if: 8 9 (A) the value of the property stolen is \$100,000 or more but less than \$200,000; [or] 10 11 (B) the value of the property stolen is less than \$200,000 and the property stolen is an automated teller machine or 12 the contents or components of an automated teller machine; 13 14 (C) the value of the property stolen is \$10,000 or more but less than \$200,000 and the property stolen is pipeline 15 equipment or oil and gas equipment as defined by Section 112.001, 16 Natural Resources Code; or 17 18 (D) the value of the property stolen is \$10,000 or more but less than \$200,000 and the property stolen is oil or gas as 19 defined by Section 115.001, Natural Resources Code or condensate. 20 21 SECTION 2. Section 31.03 (f)(2), Penal Code is amended to 22 read as follows: (f) An offense described for purposes of punishment by 23 Subsections (e)(1)-(6) is increased to the next higher category of 24

1 offense if it is shown on the trial of the offense that:

2 (4) the actor was a Medicare provider in a contractual 3 relationship with the federal government at the time of the offense 4 and the property appropriated came into the actor's custody, 5 possession, or control by virtue of the contractual relationship; 6 or

7 (5) during the commission of the offense, the actor 8 intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly:

9 (A) caused a fire exit alarm to sound or 10 otherwise become activated;

(B) deactivated or otherwise prevented a fire
exit alarm or retail theft detector from sounding; or

13 (C) used a shielding or deactivation instrument 14 to prevent or attempt to prevent detection of the offense by a 15 retail theft detector<u>; or</u>

16 <u>(6) the actor was in a contractual or employment</u> 17 relationship with the owner of the oil, gas, condensate, pipeline 18 equipment, or oil and gas equipment at the time of the offense and 19 the oil, gas, condensate, pipeline equipment, or oil and gas 20 equipment was in the actor's custody, possession, or control by 21 virtue of the contractual or employment relationship.

22 SECTION 3. Section 85.389, Natural Resources Code is 23 amended to read as follows:

24 (b) A person who purchases or sells oil, gas or condensate 25 without first obtaining the required registration or permits from 26 the commission for the sale or purchase of oil, gas or condensate 27 commits an offense.
