## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the recognition of state citizenship and the issuance
3	of state identification cards, driver's licenses, and occupational
4	licenses to state residents regardless of their immigration status.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. The heading to Title 11, Government Code, is
7	amended to read as follows:
8	TITLE 11. STATE SYMBOLS AND HONORS;
9	PRESERVATION; CITIZENSHIP
10	SECTION 2. Title 11, Government Code, is amended by adding
11	Subtitle C to read as follows:
12	SUBTITLE C. CITIZENSHIP
13	CHAPTER 3201. STATE CITIZENSHIP
14	Sec. 3201.001. SHORT TITLE. This Act may be cited as the
15	Texas Is Home Act.
16	Sec. 3201.002. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
17	(1) "Department" means the Texas Department of Public
18	Safety.
19	(2) "State citizen" means any individual who satisfies
20	the requirements of Section 3201.006.
21	(3) "State identification card" means the
22	identification card that a state citizen is eligible to receive and
23	includes a state citizen's state identification number and the
24	card's date of issuance.

- 1 (4) "State identification number" means the unique
- 2 identification number assigned to a state citizen that appears on
- 3 the state citizen's state identification card.
- 4 Sec. 3201.003. STATE CITIZENSHIP. (a) The department
- 5 shall administer this chapter. The department must:
- 6 (1) recognize the state citizenship of any individual
- 7 described by Section 3201.006;
- 8 (2) grant and renew state citizenship to any
- 9 individual who meets the criteria provided by Section 3201.006(a);
- 10 (3) issue a state identification card and state
- 11 identification number to a state citizen;
- 12 (4) renew a state identification card and state
- 13 identification number issued to a state citizen who demonstrates
- 14 continued satisfaction of the criteria listed under Section
- 15 <u>3201.006; and</u>
- 16 (5) establish, publicize, and administer procedures
- 17 to grant state citizenship and issue state identification cards and
- 18 state identification numbers.
- 19 (c) The department shall adopt rules to implement this
- 20 chapter.
- 21 Sec. 3201.004. STATE CITIZENSHIP. State citizenship is a
- 22 continuing status that ends when an individual ceases to be a
- 23 <u>resident of this state.</u>
- Sec. 3201.005. EXPIRATION OF CARD AND NUMBER. A state
- 25 <u>identification card and state identification number issued under</u>
- 26 this chapter are valid until the fifth anniversary of the date of
- 27 issuance.

- 1 Sec. 3201.006. CITIZENSHIP ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA; RECORDS;
- 2 CONFIDENTIALITY. (a) An individual, regardless of the
- 3 individual's immigration status, is considered to be a state
- 4 citizen if the individual:
- 5 (1) is a resident of this state and a citizen of the
- 6 United States; or
- 7 (2) is determined by the department to satisfy the
- 8 following:
- 9 (A) has proof of the individual's identity;
- 10 <u>(B) has been a resident of this state for not less</u>
- 11 than three years;
- 12 (C) has pledged to abide by the laws of this state
- 13 and to uphold the Texas Constitution; and
- 14 (D) has attested to the individual's willingness
- 15 to serve on jury duty and to pay any taxes required under state or
- 16 <u>local law.</u>
- 17 (b) The department may not retain originals or copies of
- 18 records provided by an applicant for citizenship to prove identity,
- 19 residency, or other eligibility requirements of state citizenship.
- 20 (c) To the extent allowed by federal and state law,
- 21 information collected about applicants for state citizenship shall
- 22 be treated as confidential and may not be disclosed to governmental
- 23 entities or private parties unless the disclosure is:
- 24 (1) authorized in writing by the individual to whom
- 25 the information pertains, or if the individual is a minor or is
- 26 otherwise not legally competent, by the individual's parent or
- 27 legal guardian; or

1 (2) ordered by a court. 2 Sec. 3201.007. ACCEPTANCE REQUIRED; DENIAL OF ELIGIBILITY PROHIBITED. (a) Except as otherwise provided by federal law and 3 notwithstanding other state law, for any statutory or regulatory 4 5 requirement that an individual provide a driver's license or social security number: 6 7 (1) a state identification card shall be accepted as a valid government identification in lieu of a state driver's 8 license; and 9 10 (2) a state identification number shall be accepted in lieu of a social security number. 11 12 (b) Notwithstanding any other local or state law, including provisions in this code or the Occupations Code or Transportation 13 14 Code, a state agency or local governmental entity may not deny the 15 eligibility of an individual who holds a valid state identification card for the following licenses because of the individual's lack of 16 17 documentation on the individual's federal immigration status: (1) any license, permit, certificate, or grant of 18 permission that is required by local or state law and issued by a 19 state agency or a political subdivision of this state as a condition 20 21 for the lawful practice of any occupation, employment, trade, 22 vocation, business, or profession; and 23 (2) a driver's license. 24 Sec. 3201.008. CONSTRUCTION AND EFFECT OF CHAPTER.

This chapter may not be construed as depriving an individual of any

benefit received by the individual under law before September 1,

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- 1 (b) This chapter does not affect a state citizen's
- 2 authorization to work in the United States as provided by the
- 3 citizen's federal immigration status. This chapter does not allow
- 4 <u>an individual without federal authorization to work in the United</u>
- 5 States access to employment opportunities that are otherwise
- 6 unavailable to the individual because of the individual's federal
- 7 immigration status.
- 8 Sec. 3201.009. LOCAL LAWS. This chapter does not prevent
- 9 the establishment, continuation, or enforcement of any law or
- 10 regulation of a political subdivision of this state that protects
- 11 the rights or fosters the integration of state citizens in a manner
- 12 not inconsistent with the provisions of this chapter.
- 13 SECTION 3. (a) As soon as practicable after the effective
- 14 date of this Act, the department shall adopt the rules and
- 15 procedures necessary to implement Chapter 3201, Government Code, as
- 16 added by this Act.
- 17 (b) Not later than March 1, 2016, each state agency and
- 18 political subdivision shall:
- 19 (1) review the agency's or subdivision's rules to
- 20 ensure the rules are consistent with Chapter 3201, Government Code,
- 21 as added by this Act; and
- 22 (2) make any necessary changes to the rules.
- 23 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
