A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

relating to the authority of the Employees Retirement System of 1-20 1-21 Texas to make available a TRICARE Military Health System 1-22 1-23 supplemental plan.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 1-24 SECTION 1. Subchapter E, Chapter 1551, Insurance Code, is amended by adding Section 1551.227 to read as follows:

1-25 Sec. 1551.227. TRICARE MILITARY HEALTH SYSTEM SUPPLEMENTAL PLAN. (a) The board of trustees shall make available a TRICARE Military Health System supplemental plan to an employee or annuitant who waives coverage under the basic coverage plan under 1-26 1-27 1-28 1-29 1-30 Section 1551.1045 and is eligible for benefits under the TRICARE Military Health System. The board of trustees may not contribute to the cost of the supplemental plan, including the premium cost. (b) A plan offered under this section must be considered a 1-31 1-32
