## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 4102.151, Insurance Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 4102.151. SOLICITATION PROHIBITED [DURING NATURAL
- 8 DISASTER]. A license holder may not solicit or attempt to solicit a
- 9 client for employment [during the progress of a loss-producing
- 10 natural disaster occurrence].
- 11 SECTION 2. Section 4102.152, Insurance Code, is repealed.
- SECTION 3. Section 38.12(d), Penal Code, is amended to read
- 13 as follows:
- 14 (d) A person commits an offense if the person:
- 15 (1) is an attorney, chiropractor, physician, surgeon,
- 16 [er] private investigator, or public insurance adjuster licensed to
- 17 practice in this state, or any person licensed, certified, or
- 18 registered by a health care regulatory agency of this state, or any
- 19 vendor or agent for or representative of an insurance company
- 20 <u>authorized to engage in the business of automobile or other</u>
- 21 property and casualty insurance in this state who discusses the
- 22 settlement or evaluation of a casualty claim or the casualty
- 23 portion of a claim; and
- 24 (2) with the intent to obtain professional employment

- 1 for the person or for another, provides or knowingly permits to be
- 2 provided to an individual who has not sought the person's
- 3 employment, legal representation, advice, or care a written
- 4 communication or a solicitation, including a solicitation in person
- 5 or by telephone, that:
- 6 (A) concerns an action for personal injury or
- 7 wrongful death or otherwise relates to an accident or disaster
- 8 involving the person to whom the communication or solicitation is
- 9 provided or a relative of that person and that was provided before
- 10 the 31st day after the date on which the accident or disaster
- 11 occurred;
- 12 (B) concerns a specific matter and relates to legal
- 13 representation and the person knows or reasonably should know that
- 14 the person to whom the communication or solicitation is directed is
- 15 represented by a lawyer in the matter;
- 16 (C) concerns a lawsuit of any kind, including an
- 17 action for divorce, in which the person to whom the communication or
- 18 solicitation is provided is a defendant or a relative of that
- 19 person, unless the lawsuit in which the person is named as a
- 20 defendant has been on file for more than 31 days before the date on
- 21 which the communication or solicitation was provided;
- (D) is provided or permitted to be provided by a
- 23 person who knows or reasonably should know that the injured person
- 24 or relative of the injured person has indicated a desire not to be
- 25 contacted by or receive communications or solicitations concerning

- 27 (E) involves coercion, duress, fraud, overreaching,

- 1 harassment, intimidation, or undue influence; or
- 2 (F) contains a false, fraudulent, misleading,
- 3 deceptive, or unfair statement or claim.
- 4 SECTION 4. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 5 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 6 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 7 governed by the law in effect at the time the offense was committed,
- 8 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 9 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 10 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred
- 11 before that date.
- 12 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
