- 8 shall receive <u>an annual</u> [a] salary <u>from the state that is 28 percent</u>
- 9 of the annual state salary of a district judge [not to exceed
- 10 \$33,000 a year. The Texas Judicial Council shall set the salary
- 11 biennially and, in arriving at the amount of the salary, shall
- 12 consider whether the presiding judge is active in administrative
- 13 duties, performs part time, or is a retired judge. The salary set
- 14 by the Texas Judicial Council shall be apportioned to each county in
- 15 the region according to the population of the counties comprising
- 16 the region and shall be paid through the county budget process].
- 17 (c) A presiding judge who is a retired or former district
- 18 judge or a retired appellate judge and who presides over an
- 19 administrative region with 30 or more district courts, statutory
- 20 county courts, and retired and former judges named on the list

 12 under Section 74.005 does not resume service as a judicial officer

 13 for purposes of Sections 832.102 and 837.102, and the retiree's

 14 annuity payments will not be suspended [The salary shall be

 15 apportioned to each county in the region according to the

 16 population of the counties comprising the region].
- 17 A former judge appointed to serve as a presiding judge under Section 74.005 is entitled to service credit in the Judicial 18 Retirement System of Texas Plan One or the Judicial Retirement 19 System of Texas Plan Two in which the judge is a member for each 20 21 month in which the former judge serves as a presiding judge [Each 22 county comprising the administrative region shall pay annually to the presiding judge, out of the officers' salary fund or the general 23 24 fund of the county, the amount of the salary apportioned to it as 25 provided by this section and the other expenses authorized by this chapter that are not paid by state appropriations. The presiding 26 judge shall place each county's payment of salary and other 27
