Section 28.025, Education Code, is amended by 5 adding Subsections (c-7) and (c-8) to read as follows: 6 (c-7) Subject to Subsection (c-8), a student who is enrolled 7 in a special education program under Subchapter A, Chapter 29, may 8 9 earn an endorsement on the student's transcript by: (1) successfully completing, with or without 10 11 modification of the curriculum: 12 (A) the curriculum requirements identified by the State Board of Education under Subsection (a); and 13 14 (B) the additional endorsement curriculum requirements prescribed by the State Board of Education under 15 16 Subsection (c-2); and (2) successfully completing all curriculum 17 requirements for that endorsement adopted by the State Board of 18 19 Education: 20 (A) without modification of the curriculum; or 21 (B) with modification of the curriculum if the courses are part of a coherent sequence of coursework that is 22 23 sufficiently rigorous as determined by the student's admission, review, and dismissal committee. 24

1 (c-8) For purposes of Subsection (c-7), the admission, 2 review, and dismissal committee of a student in a special education 3 program under Subchapter A, Chapter 29, shall determine whether the 4 student is required to achieve satisfactory performance on an 5 end-of-course assessment instrument to earn an endorsement on the 6 student's transcript.

7 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2015-20168 school year.

9 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
