8	STUDY. (a) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall
9	conduct a feasibility study that explores postsecondary distance
10	learning opportunities in accordance with this section.
11	(b) The coordinating board must conduct the feasibility
12	study with respect to at least the Rio Grande Valley region of this
13	state. The study must:
14	(1) explore the possibility of:
15	(A) using technology to connect medical schools
16	with other medical entities in this state;
17	(B) allowing secondary and postsecondary
18	students to experience distance learning opportunities through
19	attendance of appropriate postsecondary courses through live,
20	full-motion videoconferencing; and
21	(C) offering virtual, interactive undergraduate
22	or graduate degree programs to secondary or postsecondary students,
23	as appropriate; and
24	(2) identify possible impediments to postsecondary

1 distance learning opportunities, including program accreditation 2 requirements and the availability of funds for that purpose.

3 (c) The coordinating board shall post the results of the 4 feasibility study on its website.

5 SECTION 2. Not later than September 1, 2016, the Texas 6 Higher Education Coordinating Board shall develop and begin 7 conducting the feasibility study required under Section 51.981, 8 Education Code, as added by this Act.

9 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
