## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to a fishing license fee waiver for certain residents.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Sections 46.004(b) and (c), Parks and Wildlife
- 5 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 6 (b) The commission may establish a lower fee or waive the
- 7 fee or license requirement for:
- 8 (1) a resident who has a general commercial
- 9 fisherman's license of this state;
- 10 (2) a resident who is blind as defined by Section
- 11 94.001, Human Resources Code;
- 12 (3) a resident or nonresident who is under 17 years
- 13 old; or
- 14 (4) a [resident or] nonresident who is 65 years old or
- 15 over.
- 16 (c) The commission shall waive the fee for:
- 17 (1) a qualified disabled veteran as defined by Section
- 18 42.012 and for a resident on active duty as a member of the United
- 19 States military forces, the Texas Army National Guard, the Texas
- 20 Air National Guard, or the Texas State Guard; and
- 21 (2) a resident who is 65 years old or over.
- 22 SECTION 2. (a) The change in law made by this Act applies
- 23 only to a fee charged for a fishing license issued on or after the
- 24 effective date of this Act.

- 1 (b) A fishing license issued before the effective date of
- 2 this Act is covered by the law in effect when the license was
- 3 issued, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 4 The Parks and Wildlife Department is not required to issue a refund
- 5 for any license issued before the effective date of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
