## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the administration of assessment instruments to certain

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5 SECTION 1. Section 39.023(1), Education Code, as effective

until on or before September 1, 2015, is amended to read as follows: 6 7 (1) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules for the administration of the assessment instruments adopted under 8 9 Subsection (a) or the end-of-course assessment instruments adopted under Subsection (c) in Spanish to students in grades three through 10 12 [five] who are of limited English proficiency, as defined by 11 12 Section 29.052, whose primary language is Spanish, and who are not otherwise exempt from the administration of an assessment 13 14 instrument under Section 39.027(a)(1) or (2). Each student of 15 limited English proficiency whose primary language is Spanish, 16 other than a student to whom Subsection (b) applies, may be assessed 17 using assessment instruments in Spanish under this subsection [for up to three years] or assessment instruments in English under 18 Subsection (a) or end-of-course assessment instruments in English 19 under Subsection (c). The language proficiency assessment 20 21 committee established under Section 29.063 shall determine which students are administered assessment instruments in Spanish under 22

SECTION 2. Section 39.023(1), Education Code, as effective

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1 on or before September 1, 2015, is amended to read as follows:

- 2 The State Board of Education shall adopt rules for the 3 administration of the assessment instruments adopted under Subsection (a) or the end-of-course assessment instruments adopted 4 under Subsection (c) and, to the extent applicable, the assessment 5 instruments adopted under Subsection (a-4) in Spanish to students 6 in grades three through 12 [, four, and five] who are of limited 7 8 English proficiency, as defined by Section 29.052, whose primary language is Spanish, and who are not otherwise exempt from the 9 10 administration of an assessment instrument under Section 39.027(a)(1) or (2). Each student of limited English proficiency 11 12 whose primary language is Spanish, other than a student to whom 13 Subsection (b) applies, may be assessed using assessment 14 instruments in Spanish under this subsection [for up to three 15 years] or assessment instruments in English under Subsection (a) or end-of-course assessment instruments in English under Subsection 16 17 (c) and, as applicable, Subsection (a-4). The proficiency assessment committee established under Section 29.063 18 shall determine which students are administered assessment 19 instruments in Spanish under this subsection. 20
- 21 SECTION 3. Section 39.023(1), Education Code, as effective 22 September 1, 2017, is amended to read as follows:
- (1) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules for the administration of the assessment instruments adopted under Subsection (a) or the end-of-course assessment instruments adopted under Subsection (c) in Spanish to students in grades three through 12 [five] who are of limited English proficiency, as defined by

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- 1 Section 29.052, whose primary language is Spanish, and who are not
- 2 otherwise exempt from the administration of an assessment
- 3 instrument under Section 39.027(a)(1) or (2). Each student of
- 4 limited English proficiency whose primary language is Spanish,
- 5 other than a student to whom Subsection (b) applies, may be assessed
- 6 using assessment instruments in Spanish under this subsection [for
- 7 up to three years] or assessment instruments in English under
- 8 Subsection (a) or end-of-course assessment instruments in English
- 9 under Subsection (c). The language proficiency assessment
- 10 committee established under Section 29.063 shall determine which
- 11 students are administered assessment instruments in Spanish under
- 12 this subsection.
- SECTION 4. This Act applies beginning with the 2015-2016
- 14 school year.
- SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
