## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to exempting certain licensees and permittees from the
- 3 food service requirements of a food and beverage certificate issued
- 4 under the Alcoholic Beverage Code.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 25.13(b), Alcoholic Beverage Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (b) An applicant or holder of a food and beverage
- 9 certificate shall have food service facilities for the preparation
- 10 and service of multiple entrees. The commission shall adopt rules
- 11 as necessary to assure that the holder of a food and beverage
- 12 certificate maintains food service as the primary business on the
- 13 premises for which a food and beverage certificate has been issued.
- 14 The commission may exempt permittees who are concessionaires in
- 15 public entertainment venues such as sports stadiums and convention
- 16 centers from the requirement that food service be the primary
- 17 business on the premises. The commission may exempt the holder of a
- 18 brewpub license who sells alcoholic beverages manufactured only on
- 19 <u>the brewpub's premises from:</u>
- 20 (1) the requirement that the license holder have food
- 21 service facilities for the preparation and service of multiple
- 22 entrees;
- 23 (2) the requirement that food service be the primary
- 24 business on the premises; or

(3) any other requirement relating to food service. 1 2 SECTION 2. Section 69.16(b), Alcoholic Beverage Code, is 3 amended to read as follows: 4 An applicant or holder of a food and beverage 5 certificate shall have food service facilities for the preparation and service of multiple entrees. The commission shall adopt rules 6 as necessary to assure that the holder of a food and beverage 7 8 certificate maintains food service as the primary business on the premises for which a food and beverage certificate has been issued. 9 The commission may exempt permittees who are concessionaires in 10 public entertainment venues such as sports stadiums and convention 11 centers from the requirement that food service be the primary 12 business on the premises. The commission may exempt the holder of a 13 14 brewpub license who sells alcoholic beverages manufactured only on 15 the brewpub's premises from: 16 (1) the requirement that the license holder have food 17 service facilities for the preparation and service of multiple 18 entrees; 19 (2) the requirement that food service be the primary business on the premises; or

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2016.

(3) any other requirement relating to food service.
