## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to public school safety and security policies, procedures, 3 and practices.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 37.108, Education Code, is amended by 6 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (b-1) to read as 7 follows:

8 (a) Each school district or public junior college district 9 shall adopt and implement a multihazard emergency operations plan 10 for use in the district's facilities. The plan must address 11 mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery as defined by the 12 commissioner of education or commissioner of higher education in 13 conjunction with the governor's office of homeland security. The 14 plan must provide for:

15 (1) district employee training in responding to an 16 emergency;

17 (2)

if the plan applies to a school district<u>:</u>

18 <u>(A)</u> [7] mandatory school drills and exercises to 19 prepare district students and employees for responding to an 20 emergency;

21 (B) establishment of memoranda of understanding 22 and mutual aid agreements with local law enforcement and other 23 entities with jurisdiction over emergency services provided to 24 persons residing within the attendance boundaries of the district;

No. 3596 1 and 2 (C) the implementation of routine campus safety 3 and security assessments under Subsection (b-1); 4 (3) measures to ensure coordination with the 5 Department of State Health Services and local emergency management agencies, law enforcement, health departments, 6 and fire departments in the event of an emergency; and 7 8 (4) the implementation of a safety and security audit 9 as required by Subsection (b). (b-1) In addition to conducting safety and security audits 10 under Subsection (b), each school district shall conduct routine 11 12 campus safety and security assessments throughout the school year at intervals set by the Texas School Safety Center. 13 SECTION 2. Sections 37.1081(a) and (b), Education Code, are 14 15 amended to read as follows: 16 (a) The Texas School Safety Center[, in consultation with 17 the School Safety Task Force established under Section 37.1082, shall implement [develop] a school safety certification program. 18 The Texas School Safety Center shall award a school 19 (b) safety certificate to a school district that: 20 implemented a 21 (1) has adopted and multihazard emergency operations plan as required under Section 37.108 and that 22 23 includes in that plan: 24 (A) measures for security of facilities and 25 grounds; measures for communication with parents and 26 (B) 27 the media in the event of an emergency; and

No. 3596 1 (C) an outline of safety training for school 2 employees; 3 (2) demonstrates to the center through documentation [with current written self-audit processes] that the district 4 5 conducts at least one drill per year for each of the following types of drills: 6 a school lockdown drill; 7 (A) 8 (B) an evacuation drill; 9 (C) a weather-related emergency drill; 10 (D) a reverse evacuation drill; and a shelter-in-place drill; 11 (E) 12 (3) addresses circumstances that may be unique to the region in which the district is located and that affect: 13 (A) facilities and security; or 14 15 (B) the safety of students [is in compliance with 16 Sections 37.108(b) and (c)]; and 17 (4) meets any other eligibility criteria [as] recommended by the former School Safety Task Force. 18 SECTION 3. Section 37.202, Education Code, is amended to 19 read as follows: 20 21 Sec. 37.202. PURPOSE. The purpose of the center is to serve 22 as: (1) a central location for school safety and security 23 24 information, including research, training, and technical assistance related to successful school safety and security 25 26 programs; (2) a central registry of persons providing school 27

1 safety and security consulting services in the state; [and] (3) a resource for the prevention of youth violence 2 3 and the promotion of safety in the state; and 4 (4) a central location for the collection of information concerning research and best practices for threat 5 awareness, campus safety and security assessments, and 6 cross-jurisdictional sharing of information. 7 8 SECTION 4. Sections 37.203(a) and (b), Education Code, are amended to read as follows: 9 10 (a) The center is advised by a board of directors composed of: 11 12 (1)the attorney general, or the attorney general's 13 designee; 14 (2) the commissioner, or the commissioner's designee; 15 (3) the executive director of the Texas Juvenile <u>Justice Departmen</u>t [Probation Commission], or the executive 16 17 director's designee; (4) [the executive commissioner of the Texas Youth 18 Commission, or the executive commissioner's designee; 19 [<del>(5)</del>] the commissioner of the Department of State 20 Health Services, or the commissioner's designee; 21 (5) [(6)] the commissioner of higher education, or the 22 commissioner's designee; and 23 24 (6)  $\left[\frac{(7)}{(7)}\right]$  the following members appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the senate: 25 26 (A) a juvenile court judge; a member of a school district's board of 27 (B)

1 trustees; an administrator of a public primary school; 2 (C) 3 (D) an administrator of a public secondary school; 4 5 (E) member of the state parent-teacher а 6 association; 7 a teacher from a public primary or secondary (F) 8 school; 9 (G) a public school superintendent who is a 10 member of the Texas Association of School Administrators; a school district police officer or a peace 11 (H) 12 officer whose primary duty consists of working in a public school; 13 [<del>and</del>] 14 (I) an individual who has experience and 15 expertise in information technology security; 16 (J) a school district employee whose primary duty 17 consists of managing transportation logistics for a public school 18 district; 19 (K) an architect with experience in school 20 facility design; and 21 (L) two members of the public who are a parent or guardian of a public school student. 22 23 Members of the board appointed under Subsection (a)(6) (b) 24  $\left[\frac{(a)(7)}{(7)}\right]$  serve staggered two-year terms, with the terms of the members described by Subsections (a)(6)(A)-(F) [(a)(7)(A)-(E)]25 26 expiring on February 1 of each odd-numbered year and the terms of the members described by Subsections (a)(6)(G)-(L) [(a)(7)(F)-(I)]27

H.B. No. 3596 expiring on February 1 of each even-numbered year. A member may 1 serve more than one term. 2 SECTION 5. Section 37.205, Education Code, is amended to 3 read as follows: 4 Sec. 37.205. SAFETY TRAINING PROGRAMS. 5 The center shall conduct for school districts a safety training program that 6 includes: 7 8 (1)development of a positive school environment and proactive safety measures designed to address local concerns; 9 10 (2) school safety courses for law enforcement officials, with a focus on school district police officers and 11 school resource officers; 12 (3) discussion of school safety issues with parents 13 14 and community members; [and] 15 (4) assistance in developing a multihazard emergency operations plan for adoption under Section 37.108; and 16 17 (5) training in best practices for threat awareness, implementation of campus safety and security assessments, and 18 19 cross-jurisdictional sharing of information. SECTION 6. Section 421.901, Government Code, is amended to 20 read as follows: 21 Sec. 421.901. INTEROPERABILITY OF CRITICAL INFORMATION 22 23 SYSTEMS. The office of the governor shall develop a plan for 24 appropriate entities to use information systems that: 25 employ underlying computer equipment and software (1)26 required to establish interoperable communication between computer systems used by local, state, and federal agencies and first 27

2 (2) provide a single point of entry to disseminate
3 information, applications, processes, and communications;

4 <u>(3) provide threat awareness information that may</u> 5 <u>affect campus security and student safety in the Texas-Mexico</u> 6 <u>border region and is obtained through cross-jurisdictional sharing</u> 7 <u>of information; and</u>

8 <u>(4) include school security information that may be</u> 9 obtained through school district incident reporting, school safety 10 <u>audits, and campus safety and security assessments</u>.

11 SECTION 7. Sections 37.1081(c) and 37.1082, Education Code, 12 are repealed.

SECTION 8. (a) Not later than February 1, 2016, 13 the 14 governor shall appoint new members to the board of directors of the 15 Texas School Safety Center as required by Sections 37.203(a)(6)(I)-(K), Education Code, as added by this Act. 16

17 (b) Section 37.203, Education Code, as amended by this Act, does not affect the term of the member appointed under Section 18 37.203(a)(6)(F), Education Code, as amended by this Act, and 19 serving on the board immediately before the effective date of this 20 21 Act. After the term of that member expires on February 1, 2016, the governor shall appoint a member who meets the requirements under 22 Section 37.203(a)(6)(F), Education Code, as amended by this Act, to 23 24 a term expiring February 1, 2017.

(c) Section 37.203, Education Code, as amended by this Act,
does not affect the terms of the members appointed under Section
37.203(a)(6)(L), Education Code, as amended by this Act, and

serving on the board immediately before the effective date of this
 Act. After the terms of those members expire, the governor shall
 appoint members who meet the requirements under Section
 37.203(a)(6)(L), Education Code, as amended by this Act.

5 SECTION 9. This Act applies beginning with the 2015-2016 6 school year.

7 SECTION 10. This Act takes effect immediately if it 8 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each 9 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. 10 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate 11 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
