- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 37.108, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (b-1) to read as
- 7 follows:
- 8 (a) Each school district or public junior college district
- 9 shall adopt and implement a multihazard emergency operations plan
- 10 for use in the district's facilities. The plan must address
- 11 mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery as defined by the
- 12 commissioner of education or commissioner of higher education in
- 13 conjunction with the governor's office of homeland security. The
- 14 plan must provide for:
- 15 (1) district employee training in responding to an
- 16 emergency;
- 17 (2) if the plan applies to a school district:
- 18 (A) [τ] mandatory school drills and exercises to
- 19 prepare district students and employees for responding to an
- 20 emergency;
- 21 (B) establishment of memoranda of understanding
- 22 and mutual aid agreements with local law enforcement and other
- 23 entities with jurisdiction over emergency services provided to
- 24 persons residing within the attendance boundaries of the district;

- 3 and security assessments under Subsection (b-1);

- 8 (4) the implementation of a safety and security audit

- 13 at intervals set by the Texas School Safety Center.

- 9 proactive safety measures designed to address local concerns;

- 15 (4) assistance in developing a multihazard emergency

- 17 (b) Section 37.203, Education Code, as amended by this Act,
- 18 does not affect the term of the member appointed under Section
- 19 37.203(a)(6)(F), Education Code, as amended by this Act, and
- 20 serving on the board immediately before the effective date of this
- 21 Act. After the term of that member expires on February 1, 2016, the
- 22 governor shall appoint a member who meets the requirements under
- 23 Section 37.203(a)(6)(F), Education Code, as amended by this Act, to
- 24 a term expiring February 1, 2017.
- 25 (c) Section 37.203, Education Code, as amended by this Act,
- 26 does not affect the terms of the members appointed under Section
- 27 37.203(a)(6)(L), Education Code, as amended by this Act, and

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- 1 serving on the board immediately before the effective date of this
- 2 Act. After the terms of those members expire, the governor shall
- 3 appoint members who meet the requirements under Section
- 4 37.203(a)(6)(L), Education Code, as amended by this Act.
- 5 SECTION 9. This Act applies beginning with the 2015-2016
- 6 school year.
- 7 SECTION 10. This Act takes effect immediately if it
- 8 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
- 9 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 10 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate
- 11 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
