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- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5
- 6 SECTION 1. Chapter 434, Government Code, is amended by
- 7 adding Subchapter H to read as follows:

8 SUBCHAPTER H. VETERANS BENEFITS ASSISTANCE

- 9 Sec. 434.351. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
- (1) "Accredited," with respect to an individual, means 10
- the individual is authorized by the United States Department of 11
- 12 Veterans Affairs through accreditation recognition to provide
- assistance to claimants in the preparation, presentation, or 13
- prosecution of claims for veterans benefits. 14
- (2) "Assistance," with respect to an initial claim for 15
- veterans benefits, means providing claimant-specific advice, 16
- direction, and recommendations for or preparing or submitting an 17
- application or other forms for veterans benefits on behalf of a 18
- 19 claimant.
- (3) "Claimant" means an individual who has filed or 20
- 21 has expressed to an individual who is a service organization
- representative, agent, or attorney and who is accredited an 22
- 23 intention to file a written application for determination of
- entitlement to veterans benefits and implementing directives. 2.4

1 "Commission" means the Texas Veterans Commission. 2 (5) "Referring person" means organization, or other person who provides or may provide a 3 state-licensed service to a claimant or potential claimant and that 4 5 has a financial interest in a successful award for veterans benefits from the claimant. 6 7 (6) "Veterans benefits" means a payment, service, 8 commodity, function, or status, entitlement to which is determined under a law administered by the United States Department of 9 Veterans Affairs pertaining to veterans, dependents, and survivors 10 and other potential beneficiaries under Title 38, Code of Federal 11 12 Regulations. Sec. 434.352. EXEMPTION. (a) An accredited representative 13 14 of the following organizations is exempt from this subchapter: 15 (1) American Legion; 16 (2) Veterans of Foreign Wars; and 17 (3) Disabled American Veterans. (b) An accredited representative of the commission is 18 19 exempt from Section 434.353. Sec. 434.353. DISCLOSURE REQUIREMENTS FOR ASSISTING 20 CLAIMANT. (a) Each individual offering to provide or providing 21 assistance to a veteran with an initial claim for veterans benefits 22 shall certify the following in writing on a form approved by the 23 24 commission: 25 (1) that the individual has provided evidence from the

United States Department of Veterans Affairs to the claimant that

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the individual is:

1	(A) currently accredited, in compliance with the								
2	provisions of Title 38, Code of Federal Regulations; or								
3	(B) nonaccredited and working as an accredited								
4	attorney's representative in compliance with Title 38, Code of								
5	Federal Regulations, relating to authorized claim representation								
6	under an attorney;								
7	(2) that the claimant or members of the claimant's								
8	family did not make any payment, direct or indirect, including any								
9	disguised fees, in consideration for providing assistance with an								
10	initial claim for veterans benefits;								
11	(3) that the individual did not coerce the claimant or								
12	members of the claimant's family into any monetary arrangement that								
13	benefits the individual providing assistance; and								
14	(4) that if, as a result of the individual providing								
15	assistance for a claim, income is accrued to the individual								
16	providing assistance from the sale of a product or services to the								
17	claimant or members of the claimant's family, the income is both								
18	justified and reasonable as compared with income from similar								
19	products or services available in the community.								
20	(b) A referring person or the individual providing								
21	assistance under this section shall provide to each claimant or								
22	each member of the claimant's family a written disclosure of the								
23	requirements of this subchapter in a form approved by the								
24	commission.								
25	(c) The disclosure form required by Subsection (b) must be								
26	signed by the individual providing assistance with an initial claim								
27	for veterans benefits or the referring person, as applicable, and								

- 1 by the claimant or members of the claimant's family. The individual
- 2 providing assistance and referring person shall:
- 3 (1) provide copies of the disclosure form to the
- 4 claimant or members of the claimant's family receiving assistance
- 5 or a referral for assistance, as applicable, on the day the form is
- 6 <u>completed and signed;</u> and
- 7 (2) retain the disclosure form until the third
- 8 anniversary of the date the form is signed.
- 9 Sec. 434.354. COMPLAINT PROCEDURES; AUDITS. (a) The
- 10 commission shall establish procedures for processing complaints
- 11 related to the provision of assistance with an initial claim for
- 12 veterans benefits.
- 13 (b) The commission shall investigate each complaint filed
- 14 with the commission to determine whether an individual violated
- 15 <u>this subchapter.</u>
- 16 (c) If, after an investigation, the commission determines
- 17 that an individual has violated this subchapter, the commission
- 18 shall:
- 19 (1) report the violation for criminal prosecution to
- 20 the appropriate prosecuting attorney in the county in which the
- 21 <u>violation occurred; and</u>
- (2) notify the United States Department of Veterans
- 23 Affairs of:
- 24 (A) an accredited individual's violation of
- 25 Title 38, Code of Federal Regulations; or
- 26 (B) a nonaccredited individual who is providing
- 27 assistance with an initial claim for veterans benefits in violation

- 1 of Title 38, Code of Federal Regulations.
- 2 (d) The commission shall randomly audit accredited
- 3 individuals and referring persons to determine compliance with this
- 4 subchapter.
- 5 Sec. 434.355. COMMISSION DUTIES. The commission shall
- 6 notify annually, or more often as necessary, each accredited
- 7 <u>individual and referring person of the disclosure requirements of</u>
- 8 this subchapter, including the requirement:
- 9 (1) to provide a disclosure form to each claimant or
- 10 members of the claimant's family as provided by Section 434.353;
- 11 (2) that a copy of the completed, signed disclosure
- 12 form be:
- 13 (A) provided to the commission; and
- 14 (B) retained for three years from the date of
- 15 signing; and
- 16 (3) that referring persons may refer individuals to
- 17 provide assistance with an initial claim for veterans benefits only
- 18 if those individuals are accredited or, if nonaccredited, are a
- 19 representative of an accredited attorney.
- 20 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 21 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 22 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 23 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 24 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
