A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the licensing and regulation of Auctioneers. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 1802.001, Occupations Code, is amended 4 5 to read as follows: 6 Sec. 1802.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter: "Advisory board" means the Auctioneer [Education] 7 (1) Advisory Board. 8 "Auction" 9 (3) means the sale of property by competitive bid using any method, format, or venue. 10 "Auction company" means a person who engages in 11 (4) 12 the business of arranging, managing, sponsoring, advertising, or conducting auctions. 13 14 (5) "Auctioneer" means any individual [person] who: 15 (A) sells or offers to sell property of another person by live bid at auction, with or without receiving 16 consideration[; or 17 18 (B) solicits, negotiates, or executes an auction listing contract]. 19 (6) "Commission" 20 means the Texas Commission of 21 Licensing and Regulation. 22 (8) "Department" means Department the Texas of 23 Licensing and Regulation. (8-a) "Executive director" 24 the executive means

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1 director of the department.

2 (9) "Fund" means the auctioneer education and recovery3 fund.

4 (10) "Personal property" means any property other than
5 real property[, including all tangible and intangible types of
6 property].

7 (11) "Real property" means land, including 8 improvements, fixtures, and other property appurtenant to or used 9 in connection with the land, and any other estate, interest, or 10 legal or equitable right in the land, improvement, fixture, or 11 appurtenant property.

12 [(12) "Recurring basis" means more than once every 24 13 months.]

14 (13) "Sealed bid auction" means a sealed bidding 15 procedure that incorporates or allows for the competitive 16 increasing or decreasing of bids after the opening of sealed bids.

17 SECTION 2. Section 1802.002(a), Occupations Code, is 18 amended to read as follows:

19 Sec. 1802.002. APPLICABILITY. (a) This chapter does not 20 apply to:

(1) a sale conducted by order of a United States courtunder Title 11, United States Code;

(2) a sale conducted by an employee of the United
States, this state, or a political subdivision of this state in the
course and scope of employment;

(3) a sale conducted by a charitable, religious, orcivic organization, including an organization having a tax exempt

4 [(4) a sale conducted by any person of the person's 5 property if the person is not engaged in the business of selling property at auction on a recurring basis; 6 7 (5) a foreclosure sale of real property personally 8 conducted by a trustee under a deed of trust; 9 a foreclosure sale of personal property personally (6) 10 conducted by: 11 (A) a person who holds a security interest in the 12 property, including a mortgage; or an employee or agent of a person described by 13 (B) 14 Paragraph (A) acting in the course and scope of employment, if: 15 (i) the employee or agent is not otherwise 16 engaged in the auction business; and 17 (ii) all property for sale in the auction is subject to a security agreement; 18 a sale conducted by sealed bid without the option 19 (7) of increasing or decreasing the amount of a bid; 20 21 (8) an auction conducted only for student training purposes as part of a course of study approved by the department; 22 an auction conducted by a posted stockyard or 23 (9) 24 market agency as defined by the federal Packers and Stockyards Act (7 U.S.C. Section 181 et seq.), as amended; 25 (10) an auction of livestock conducted by a nonprofit 26 27 livestock trade association chartered in this state, if the auction

as a nonprofit entity, if the person organizing,

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involves only the sale of livestock owned by members of the trade 1 association; 2 3 an auction conducted by a charitable or nonprofit (11)4 organization chartered in this state, if the auction: (A) is part of a fair that is organized under 5 6 state, county, or municipal authority; and 7 involves only the sale of property owned by (B) 8 the organization's members; or (12) a sale or auction conducted by an auctioneer, 9 while the auctioneer is physically located outside of this state. 10 11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect on September 1, 2015. SECTION 4. Not later than March 1, 2016, the Texas 12 Commission of Licensing and Regulation shall adopt rules to 13 implement the changes made by this Act. 14

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
