A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the employment requirements of a person working as a
- 3 cashier for transactions involving the sale of alcoholic beverages.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 106.09, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 106.09. EMPLOYMENT OF MINORS. (a) Except as provided
- 8 in Subsections (b), (c), and (e), and (f) of this section, no person
- 9 may employ a person under 18 years of age to sell, prepare, serve,
- 10 or otherwise handle liquor, or to assist in doing so.
- 11 (b) A holder of a wine only package store permit may employ a
- 12 person 16 years old or older to work in any capacity.
- 13 (c) A holder of a permit or license providing for the
- 14 on-premises consumption of alcoholic beverages may employ a person
- 15 under 18 years of age to work in any capacity other than the actual
- 16 selling, preparing, or serving of alcoholic beverages.
- 17 (d) The fact that a person is 18, 19, or 20 years of age is
- 18 not a ground for refusal of an original or renewal permit or license
- 19 issued under Chapter 35, 36, or 73, provided that such a person to
- 20 whom a permit or license is issued may carry out the activities
- 21 authorized by those chapters only while in the actual course and
- 22 scope of the person's employment.
- (e) The holder of a permit or license providing for the
- 24 on-premises consumption of alcoholic beverages who also holds a

- 1 food and beverage certificate may employ a person under 18 years of
- 2 age to work as a cashier for transactions involving the sale of
- 3 alcoholic beverages if the alcoholic beverages are served by a
- 4 person 18 years of age or older.
- 5 (f) The holder of a permit or license providing for the
- 6 on-premises consumption of alcoholic beverages if less than 50
- 7 percent of the gross receipts for the premises is from the sale or
- 8 <u>service of alcoholic beverages may employ a person under 18 years of</u>
- 9 age to work as a cashier for transactions involving the sale of
- 10 alcoholic beverages if the alcoholic beverages are served by a
- 11 person 18 years of age or older.
- 12 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 16 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
