13 (5) a statement of any condition on which the permit is14 issued;

15 (6) a statement that the cargo may [<del>only</del>] be 16 transported in San Patricio and Nueces Counties only over the roads 17 described by or designated under Section 623.303 [to and from the port authority's La Quinta terminal in San Patricio County using a 18 19 state highway special freight corridor in San Patricio County]; and (7) the location where the cargo was loaded. 20

SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
