- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4
- SECTION 1. Section 2.02(c), Alcoholic Beverage Code, is 5
- amended to read as follows:
- 7 (c) An adult who is 21 years of age or older or at least 18
- years of age and a member of the United States armed forces on 8
- 9 active duty is liable for damages proximately caused by the
- intoxication of a minor under the age of 18 if: 10
- 11 (1) the adult is not:
- 12 (A) the minor's parent, guardian, or spouse; or
- 13 an adult in whose custody the minor has been (B)
- committed by a court; and 14
- (2) the adult knowingly: 15
- served or provided to the minor any of the 16
- alcoholic beverages that contributed to the minor's intoxication; 17
- 18 οr

- (B) allowed the minor to be served or provided 19
- any of the alcoholic beverages that contributed to the minor's 20
- 21 intoxication on the premises owned or leased by the adult.
- SECTION 2. Sections 16.09(c) and (d), Alcoholic Beverage 22
- 23 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- (c) Wine shipped by the holder of a winery permit may not be 24

- 1 delivered to any person other than:
- 2 (1) the person who purchased the wine;
- 3 (2) a recipient designated in advance by such
- 4 purchaser; or
- 5 (3) a person at the delivery address who is age 21 or
- 6 over or at least 18 years of age and a member of the United States
- 7 <u>armed forces on active duty</u>.
- 8 (d) Wine may be delivered only to a person who is age 21 or
- 9 over or at least 18 years of age and a member of the United States
- 10 <u>armed forces on active duty</u> after the person accepting the package:
- 11 (1) presents valid proof of identity and age <u>and</u>, <u>if</u>
- 12 applicable, proof of active duty service in the United States armed
- 13 forces; and
- 14 (2) personally signs a receipt acknowledging delivery
- 15 of the package.
- SECTION 3. Sections 22.13(a) and (b), Alcoholic Beverage
- 17 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 18 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), a [A] package
- 19 store permittee may not knowingly utilize or employ any person
- 20 under the age of 21 to work on the premises of a package store in any
- 21 capacity or to deliver alcohol off the premises of a package store.
- 22 (b) A package store permittee may employ [This section shall
- 23 not apply to] a person who is at least 18 years of age and a member
- 24 of the United States armed forces on active duty [was under the age
- 25 of 21 and employed by a package store on September 1, 1995].
- SECTION 4. Sections 54.05(b) and (c), Alcoholic Beverage
- 27 Code, are amended to read as follows:

- 1 (b) Wine sold or shipped by a holder of an out-of-state
- 2 winery direct shipper's permit may not be delivered to any person
- 3 other than:
- 4 (1) the person who purchased the wine;
- 5 (2) a recipient designated in advance by such
- 6 purchaser; or
- 7 (3) a person at the delivery address who is age 21 or
- 8 over or at least 18 years of age and a member of the United States
- 9 armed forces on active duty.
- 10 (c) Wine may be delivered only to a person who is age 21 or
- 11 over or at least 18 years of age and a member of the United States
- 12 armed forces on active duty after the person accepting the package:
- 13 (1) presents valid proof of identity and age and, if
- 14 applicable, proof of active duty service in the United States armed
- 15 <u>forces</u>; and
- 16 (2) personally signs a receipt acknowledging delivery
- 17 of the package.
- 18 SECTION 5. Section 102.19, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is
- 19 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 102.19. PROMOTIONAL GIFT WINE. A holder of a winery
- 21 permit may give one or more unopened bottles of Texas-made wine
- 22 produced or bottled by the winery to a person 21 years of age or
- 23 older or at least 18 years of age and a member of the United States
- 24 armed forces on active duty on the premises of a convention center
- 25 or civic center that holds a mixed beverage permit if no charge is
- 26 made by the winery or by the mixed beverage permittee for the wine.
- 27 A recipient of a bottle of wine under this section must take the

- 1 unopened gift bottle off the premises of the mixed beverage
- 2 permittee.
- 3 SECTION 6. Section 106.01, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is
- 4 amended to read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 106.01. DEFINITION. In this code, "minor" means a
- 6 person under 21 years of age. The term does not include a person who
- 7 <u>is at least 18 years of age and a member of the United States armed</u>
- 8 forces on active duty.
- 9 SECTION 7. Section 106.03(b), Alcoholic Beverage Code, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 (b) A person who sells a minor an alcoholic beverage does
- 12 not commit an offense if the minor falsely represents the minor
- 13 [himself] to be 21 years old or older or at least 18 years of age and
- 14 <u>a member of the United States armed forces on active duty</u> by
- 15 displaying an apparently valid proof of identification that
- 16 contains a physical description and photograph consistent with the
- 17 minor's appearance, purports to establish that the minor is 21
- 18 years of age or older or at least 18 years of age and a member of the
- 19 United States armed forces on active duty, and was issued by a
- 20 governmental agency. The proof of identification may include a
- 21 driver's license or identification card issued by the Department of
- 22 Public Safety, a passport, or a military identification card.
- 23 SECTION 8. Section 106.07(a), Alcoholic Beverage Code, is
- 24 amended to read as follows:
- 25 (a) A minor commits an offense if the minor:
- 26 (1) [he] falsely states to a person engaged in selling
- 27 or serving alcoholic beverages that the minor [he] is:

- 1 (A) 21 years of age or older; or
- 2 (B) at least 18 years of age and a member of the
- 3 United States armed forces on active duty; or
- 4 (2) presents any document to a person engaged in
- 5 selling or serving alcoholic beverages that indicates the minor
- 6 [he] is:
- 7 (A) 21 years of age or older; or
- 8 (B) at least 18 years of age and a member of the
- 9 United States armed forces on active duty [to a person engaged in
- 10 selling or serving alcoholic beverages].
- 11 SECTION 9. Section 110.054, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- 13 Sec. 110.054. DELIVERY OF WINE IN A DRY AREA. A package
- 14 store that participates in the program may ship wine under Section
- 15 110.053 to a person who resides in a dry area if:
- 16 (1) the delivery is made by the holder of a carrier
- 17 permit; and
- 18 (2) the package is clearly labeled as requiring the
- 19 signature of a person 21 years of age or older or at least 18 years
- 20 of age and a member of the United States armed forces on active duty
- 21 for delivery.
- SECTION 10. Section 49.02(e), Penal Code, is amended to
- 23 read as follows:
- (e) An offense under this section committed by a person who
- 25 is a minor for the purposes of the Alcoholic Beverage Code [younger
- 26 than 21 years of age] is punishable in the same manner as if the
- 27 minor committed an offense to which Section 106.071, Alcoholic

- 1 Beverage Code, applies.
- 2 SECTION 11. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
