6	SECTION 1. Title 7, Agriculture Code, is amended by adding
7	Chapter 202 to read as follows:

9	SUBCHAPTER A. POWERS AND DUTIES OF DEPARTMENT
10	Sec. 202.001. RULES. The department shall adopt rules that
11	are reasonable and necessary for the performance of the
12	department's duties under this chapter, including rules to
13	establish:
14	(1) licensing and other fees;
15	(2) license renewal dates;
16	(3) procedures for disciplinary actions; and
17	(4) standards for the installation and maintenance of
18	rainwater harvesting equipment by a license holder.
19	Sec. 202.002. LICENSING AND REGULATORY DUTIES. The
20	department shall:
21	(1) review and approve or reject each application for
22	the issuance or renewal of a license;
23	(2) issue each license; and
24	(3) deny, suspend, or revoke a license or otherwise

1	discipline a license holder.
2	SUBCHAPTER B. RAINWATER HARVESTING LICENSE
3	Sec. 202.051. LICENSE REQUIRED. A person may not install or
4	maintain or offer to install or maintain, for compensation, a
5	rainwater harvesting system with a capacity of more than 500
6	gallons unless the person holds:
7	(1) a license under this chapter; or
8	(2) a master plumber or a journeyman plumber license
9	issued by the Texas State Board of Plumbing Examiners and holds a
10	water supply protection specialist endorsement issued by the board.
11	Sec. 202.052. ISSUANCE OF LICENSE. The department shall
12	issue a license to an applicant who:
13	(1) meets the eligibility requirements of Section
14	<u>202.053;</u>
15	(2) submits an application on a form prescribed by the
16	department; and
17	(3) pays the required application fee.
18	Sec. 202.053. ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS. To be eligible for
19	a license under this chapter, an applicant must:
20	(1) successfully complete a rainwater harvesting
21	training program approved by the department; and
22	(2) pass an examination administered or approved by
23	the department.
24	Sec. 202.054. LICENSE TERM AND RENEWAL. (a) A license
25	issued under this chapter is valid for three years.
26	(b) A person who holds a license under this chapter may

1	(1) paying the required renewal fee;
2	(2) submitting the appropriate form; and
3	(3) meeting any other requirement established by
4	department rule.
5	Sec. 202.055. CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS. The
6	department by rule shall adopt, monitor, and enforce a reporting
7	program for the continuing education of license holders. The
8	department shall adopt and administer rules that:
9	(1) establish the number of hours of continuing
10	education the department determines appropriate as a prerequisite
11	to the renewal of a license under this chapter; and
12	(2) adopt a process to assess a license holder's
13	participation in continuing education courses.
14	SUBCHAPTER C. PENALTIES AND ENFORCEMENT PROVISIONS
15	Sec. 202.101. LICENSE SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION. The
16	department may suspend or revoke a license if the license holder
17	violates this chapter or a rule adopted under this chapter.
18	Sec. 202.102. CRIMINAL PENALTY. (a) A person commits an
19	offense if the person violates Section 202.051.
20	(b) An offense under this section is a Class C misdemeanor.
