	AN ACT
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- 2 relating to posting of certain financial information of certain
- 3 political subdivisions on the Internet.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. This Act may be cited as the Local Government
- 6 Transparency Act.
- 7 SECTION 2. Chapter 140, Local Government Code, is amended
- 8 by adding Section 140.011 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 140.011. POSTING OF FINANCIAL INFORMATION OF POLITICAL
- 10 SUBDIVISIONS ON THE INTERNET. (a) This section applies only to a
- 11 political subdivision with taxing authority, including a county,
- 12 municipality, and school district, that has a budget greater than
- 13 \$100 million.
- 14 (b) The governing body of a political subdivision shall
- 15 establish and maintain in the manner provided by this section an
- 16 <u>electronic format for accessing fin</u>ancial information regarding
- 17 the political subdivision's annual budget, check register,
- 18 <u>tax-supported debt</u>, revenue-supported debt, unfunded pension
- 19 liabilities, and unfunded other post-employment benefit
- 20 liabilities.
- 21 (c) The governing body shall post the information described
- 22 by this section on the political subdivision's Internet website.
- 23 (d) The format for a political subdivision's annual budget
- 24 must provide a display in pie charts or other graphical

- 1 representations of the political subdivision's revenue, including
- 2 taxes, and spending. The representations must provide the ability
- 3 to readily access more detailed subaccounts to a minimum level of
- 4 the lesser of seven subaccounts or the level of available
- 5 subaccount data.
- 6 (e) The format for a political subdivision's check register
- 7 must provide a searchable database that must include, for each
- 8 check issued from the political subdivision's checking account, the
- 9 check number or other payment identification, date, amount,
- 10 description, and payee. The database must include each payment
- 11 made to a vendor or elected official, and the database may not
- 12 include a payment made to a full-time unelected employee. At a
- 13 minimum, the database must allow a person to:
- 14 (1) sort information in ascending and descending order
- 15 by column heading;
- 16 (2) ascertain through a single search the payments
- 17 made to any payee; and
- 18 (3) download information yielded by a search of the
- 19 database.
- 20 (f) For purposes of including a political subdivision's
- 21 debt information under this section, the debt must be presented as
- 22 the total of the outstanding principal of the debt and any interest
- 23 and fees that will accrue over the remaining term of the debt.
- 24 (g) To the extent possible, the political subdivision shall
- 25 present the information described by this section in a manner that
- 26 may be accessed intuitively by a person using:
- 27 (1) for the political subdivision's budget, the best

- 1 available technology that provides the ability to readily access
- 2 more specific layers of data or information; and
- 3 (2) for the political subdivision's check register,
- 4 standard searching and sorting techniques.
- 5 (h) A political subdivision may not charge a fee to access
- 6 the information described by this section.
- 7 SECTION 3. Section 140.011, Local Government Code, as added
- 8 by this Act, applies only to a political subdivision's fiscal year
- 9 beginning on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 10 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
