4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 411, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 411.0094 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 411.0094. AUTOMATIC LICENSE PLATE READER SYSTEM. (a)
8	<pre>In this section:</pre>
9	(1) "Law enforcement agency" means an agency of the
0	state, or of a county, municipality, or other political subdivision

- 10 n of the state, that employs peace officers to enforce criminal laws. 11
- 12 (2) "Automatic license plate reader system" means a 13 system of one or more mobile or fixed high-speed cameras used in combination with computer algorithms to convert an image of a 14
- (3) "Captured plate data" means global positioning 16
- 17 system coordinates, dates and times, photographs, license plate
- numbers, and all other data collected by an automatic license plate 18
- reader system. 19

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- 20 (b) A law enforcement agency may use images and all related
- 21 captured plate data produced by an automatic license plate reader
- 22 system for the following law enforcement purposes:

license plate into computer-readable data.

- 23 (1) detecting or investigating a criminal offense;
- 24 (2) detecting or investigating a criminal violation of

- 1 a traffic law or vehicle compliance;
- 2 (3) investigating a report of a missing person; or
- 3 (4) investigating threats related to terrorism.
- 4 (5) in conjunction with an administrative hearing by a
- 5 law enforcement agency under the law enforcement agency's
- 6 administrative rules.
- 7 <u>(6) crime analysis; or</u>
- 8 (7) any other legitimate law enforcement purpose.
- 9 (c) The department and each law enforcement agency that uses
- 10 an automatic license plate reader system by rule or policy shall
- 11 establish an automatic license plate reader records retention
- 12 database to retain captured plate data.
- 13 (d) The department and each law enforcement agency that uses
- 14 an automatic license plate reader system shall adopt rules or
- 15 policies governing the use of the system, including rules:
- 16 (1) governing which law enforcement personnel may
- 17 search captured plate data;
- 18 (2) establishing an audit process to ensure that
- 19 captured plate data is used only for the law enforcement purposes
- 20 described by Subsection (b); and
- 21 (3) establishing procedures and safeguards to ensure
- 22 that law enforcement personnel with access to the automatic license
- 23 plate reader database are adequately screened and trained.
- (e) Not later than January 31 of each year, each law
- 25 enforcement agency that uses a license plate reader system shall
- 26 submit a report for the preceding calendar year to the department
- 27 regarding:

1	(1) the total number of automatic license plate reader
2	system units that are used by the law enforcement agency;
3	(2) the number of automatic license plate reader
4	system readings made by the law enforcement agency; and
5	(3) a list of audits completed by the law enforcement
6	agency.
7	(f) Not later than September 1 of each year, the department
8	shall submit a report for the preceding calendar year to the
9	<pre>legislature that includes:</pre>
10	(1) the number of automatic license plate reader
11	system readings retained in the automatic license plate reader
12	system database;
13	(2) the number of requests for captured plate data
14	made to the department, including:
15	(A) the total number of requests and the number
16	of requests that resulted in a release of information;
17	(B) the total number of out-of-state requests and
18	the number of out-of-state requests that resulted in a release of
19	information; and
20	(C) the total number of federal requests and the
21	number of federal requests that resulted in a release of
22	<pre>information;</pre>
23	(3) any data breach or unauthorized use of the
24	automatic license plate reader system database;
25	(4) a list of audits completed by the department and
26	each law enforcement agency reporting to the department; and
27	(5) a summary of the information contained in the

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- 1 reports submitted to the department under Subsection (e).
- 2 (g) Captured plate data is confidential and not subject to
- 3 disclosure under Chapter 552.
- 4 (h) Law enforcement personnel, as defined in Subsection
- 5 (d)(1), commits an offense if that person uses an image or any
- 6 related captured plate data produced by an automatic license plate
- 7 reader system for anything other than a valid law enforcement
- 8 purpose as listed in Subsection (b). An offense under this
- 9 subsection is a Class A misdemeanor.
- 10 (i) This act does not apply to cameras used to enforce a
- 11 civil penalty or traffic offenses nor does it restrict or prohibit
- 12 the use of a camera of any type, including those described in
- 13 Subsection (a), by any entity, including law enforcement, for the
- 14 investigation or enforcement of a civil action, civil penalty, a
- 15 civil traffic related offense or a criminal prosecution arising
- 16 from non-payment of a civil penalty or civil action.
- 17 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
