2	relating to fetal alcohol syndrome information provided to pregnant

4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 161, Health and Safety Code, is amended
6	by adding Subchapter X to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER X. INFORMATION FOR PREGNANT PATIENTS
8	Sec. 161.701. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
9	(1) "Department" means the Department of State Health
10	Services.
11	(2) "Health care provider" means:
12	(A) a physician licensed to practice medicine in
13	this state;
14	(B) a physician assistant licensed under Chapter
15	204, Occupations Code;
16	(C) a midwife licensed under Chapter 203,
17	Occupations Code;
18	(D) an advanced practice nurse as defined by
19	Section 301.152, Occupations Code;
20	(E) a hospital licensed under Chapter 241; or
21	(F) a birthing center licensed under Chapter 244.
22	(3) "Medically accurate information" means
23	<pre>information that is:</pre>
24	(A) verified or supported by the weight of

- 1 research conducted in compliance with accepted scientific methods;
- 2 (B) published in peer reviewed journals, if
- 3 appropriate; and
- 4 (C) recognized as accurate, objective, and
- 5 complete by mainstream professional organizations and agencies
- 6 with expertise in the relevant field, including:
- 7 <u>(i) the Centers for Disease Control and</u>
- 8 Prevention of the United States Public Health Service;
- 9 (ii) the American College of Obstetricians
- 10 and Gynecologists;
- 11 <u>(iii) the American Academy of Pediatrics;</u>
- 12 and
- 13 (iv) the surgeon general of the United
- 14 States Department of Health and Human Services.
- 15 Sec. 161.702. INFORMATIONAL MATERIAL PROVIDED TO PREGNANT
- 16 PATIENT. (a) A health care provider that provides care to a
- 17 pregnant patient shall, during the patient's first visit with the
- 18 provider concerning the pregnancy, make available to the patient
- 19 informational material that includes medically accurate
- 20 information about the risks of drinking alcohol while pregnant,
- 21 including fetal alcohol syndrome.
- (b) A health care provider may use the informational
- 23 material provided on the department's Internet website or
- 24 alternative informational material that provides the information
- 25 required by Subsection (a).
- Sec. 161.703. DUTIES OF DEPARTMENT. (a) The department
- 27 shall:

- 1 (1) establish guidelines for the provision of the
- 2 information required by Section 161.702;
- 3 (2) make available on the department's Internet
- 4 website a printable version of the medically accurate informational
- 5 material required by Section 161.702(a); and
- 6 (3) make the informational material required by
- 7 Section 161.702 available for distribution to health care
- 8 providers, including at the request of a provider.
- 9 (b) The department may make available online and distribute
- 10 an existing medically accurate publication created by the
- 11 department or another health and human services agency as the
- 12 informational material required by Section 161.702.
- Sec. 161.704. LIABILITY NOT CREATED. This subchapter does
- 14 not create an obligation or duty that provides a basis for a cause
- of action against a health care provider. A health care provider is
- 16 <u>immune from administrative</u>, civil, or criminal liability with
- 17 respect to an action taken or not taken under this subchapter.
- 18 SECTION 2. Not later than October 1, 2015, the Department of
- 19 State Health Services shall make available the informational
- 20 material required by Subchapter X, Chapter 161, Health and Safety
- 21 Code, as added by this Act.
- SECTION 3. Notwithstanding Subchapter X, Chapter 161,
- 23 Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act, a health care provider
- 24 is not required to comply with the requirements of Section 161.702,
- 25 Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act, before January 1,
- 26 2016.
- 27 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

- 1 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 2 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 3 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 4 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
