A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the practice of marriage and family therapy.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

4 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 502, Occupations Code, is

5 amended by adding Section 502.0021 to read as follows:

6 Sec. 502.0021. PRACTICE OF MARRIAGE AND FAMILY THERAPY.

7 (a) "Marriage and family therapy" means the provision of

8 professional therapy services to individuals, families, or married

9 couples, alone or in groups, that involve applying family systems

10 theories and techniques, including the evaluation and remediation

11 of cognitive, affective, behavioral, or relational dysfunction in

12 the context of marriage or family systems.

13 (b) The practice of marriage and family therapy may include

14 the use of the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental

15 Disorders, the International Classification of Diseases, and other

16 diagnostic classification systems and the use of billing codes in

17 connection with those systems for evaluation, classification,

18 treatment, and other activities by a person licensed under this

19 chapter, in connection with a claim for payment or reimbursement

20 from a health insurance policy issuer or other payor.

21 (c) The practice of marriage and family therapy does not

22 <u>include prescribing medication</u>, treating a physical disease, or

23 providing any service outside the scope of practice of a licensed

24 marriage and family therapist or licensed marriage and family

1 therapist associate.

- 2 SECTION 2. Section 21.003(b), Education Code, is amended to
- 3 read as follows:
- 4 (b) Except as otherwise provided by this subsection, a
- 5 person may not be employed by a school district as an audiologist,
- 6 occupational therapist, physical therapist, physician, nurse,
- 7 school psychologist, associate school psychologist, licensed
- 8 professional counselor, marriage and family therapist, social
- 9 worker, or speech language pathologist unless the person is
- 10 licensed by the state agency that licenses that profession and may
- 11 perform specific services within those professions for a school
- 12 district only if the person holds the appropriate credential from
- 13 the appropriate state agency. As long as a person employed by a
- 14 district before September 1, 2011, to perform marriage and family
- 15 therapy under Chapter 502 [, as defined by Section 502.002],
- 16 Occupations Code, is employed by the same district, the person is
- 17 not required to hold a license as a marriage and family therapist to
- 18 perform marriage and family therapy with that district.
- 19 SECTION 3. Section 502.002(6), Occupations Code, is
- 20 repealed.
- 21 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 25 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
