3	provisional Texas conditional driver's permit, and Texas
4	conditional instruction permit; authorizing a fee; creating a

6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
7	SECTION 1. Chapter 521, Transportation Code, is amended by
8	adding Subchapter K-1 to read as follows:
9	SUBCHAPTER K-1. TEXAS CONDITIONAL DRIVER'S PERMIT
10	Sec. 521.231. ELIGIBILITY. The department may issue a
11	Texas conditional driver's permit to a person who:
12	(1) as of the date the permit is issued, has resided in
13	this state for at least one year;
14	(2) is ineligible to obtain a social security number;
15	(3) is unable to present to the department
16	documentation issued by the United States agency responsible for
17	citizenship and immigration authorizing the person to be in the
18	United States;
19	(4) has not been finally convicted of a felony
20	offense; and
21	(5) regardless of the person's age, has completed a
22	driver education course required by Section 521.1601 and an
23	examination required by Section 521.161.
24	Sec. 521.232. TEXAS CONDITIONAL DRIVER'S PERMIT

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1	REQUIREMENTS. (a) A Texas conditional driver's permit issued
2	under this subchapter is valid as proof of the permit holder's
3	identity for driving purposes only. The permit is not valid as
4	proof of the permit holder's identity for any other state purpose or
5	for any federal purpose.
6	(b) The department shall:
7	(1) designate and clearly mark as a Texas conditional
8	driver's permit each permit issued under this subchapter;
9	(2) designate and clearly mark as a provisional Texas
10	conditional driver's permit each permit issued under this
11	subchapter to a person who is at least 16 years of age but younger
12	than 18 years of age;
13	(3) include on a permit issued under this subchapter
14	an indication that the permit is valid proof of identity for driving
15	purposes only, and is not valid as proof of identity for any other
16	state purpose or for any federal purpose; and
17	(4) design the Texas conditional driver's permit to
18	appear substantially different from the design of a driver's
19	license.
20	(c) Except as otherwise provided by this chapter, a person
21	who holds a Texas conditional driver's permit is subject to the laws
22	of this state applicable to the holder of an original or duplicate
23	driver's license.
24	(d) Except as otherwise provided by this chapter, an
25	applicant for a Texas conditional driver's permit who is at least 16
26	years of age but younger than 18 years of age is subject to the laws
27	of this state applicable to a holder of a provisional license.

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1	(e) The department shall adopt rules:
2	(1) regarding the design and content of the Texas
3	conditional driver's permit;
4	(2) establishing criteria for proof of identification
5	and residency of an applicant;
6	(3) designating acceptable evidence that an applicant
7	is not eligible for a social security number;
8	(4) requiring a check of state and national criminal
9	history record information to determine whether an applicant is
10	eligible for a permit under Section 521.231(4); and
11	(5) regarding the issuance of Texas conditional
12	instruction permits.
13	Sec. 521.233. APPLICATION. (a) An application for a Texas
14	conditional driver's permit must state the applicant's full name
15	and place and date of birth. This information must be verified by
16	presentation of:
17	(1) a current passport or consular document issued to
18	the applicant by the country of which the applicant is a citizen; or
19	(2) another identification document the department
20	determines by rule is acceptable as proof of the information.
21	(b) The application must include:
22	(1) a complete electronic set of the applicant's
23	fingerprints;
24	(2) a photograph of the applicant;
25	(3) the signature of the applicant;
26	(4) a brief description of the applicant;
27	(5) any information necessary to perform a criminal

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1	history background check on the applicant; and
2	(6) evidence that the applicant has resided in this
3	state for at least one year.
4	(c) The application must state:
5	(1) the sex of the applicant;
6	(2) the residence address of the applicant;
7	(3) whether the applicant has been licensed to drive a
8	motor vehicle before;
9	(4) if previously licensed:
10	(A) when and by what state or country;
11	(B) whether that license has been suspended or
12	revoked or a license application denied; and
13	(C) the date and reason for the suspension,
14	revocation, or denial; and
15	(5) the county of residence of the applicant.
16	(d) Regardless of the applicant's age, the application must
17	state whether the applicant has completed a driver education course
18	required by Section 521.1601 and an examination required by Section
19	521.161.
20	(e) The application must be accompanied by evidence of
21	financial responsibility that complies with Subchapter D, Chapter
22	601, and is prepaid and valid for at least a six-month period, or by
23	a statement that the applicant does not own a motor vehicle for
24	which evidence of financial responsibility is required under
25	Chapter 601. The department may require an application for a
26	renewal of a conditional driver's permit to be accompanied by
27	evidence of financial responsibility or a statement that the

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1	applicant does not own a motor vehicle for which evidence of
2	financial responsibility is required under Chapter 601.
3	(f) Evidence of financial responsibility presented under
4	this section must comply with the requirements of Section 521.143.
5	(g) The application must include any other information the
6	department requires to determine the applicant's identity,
7	residency, competency, and eligibility as required by the
8	department or state law.
9	(h) Information supplied to the department relating to an
10	applicant's medical history is for the confidential use of the
11	department and may not be disclosed to any person or used as
12	evidence in a legal proceeding other than a proceeding under
13	Subchapter N. This subsection does not apply to information
14	provided by an applicant under Subsection (i).
15	(i) The application must provide space for the applicant to
16	voluntarily list any health condition that may impede communication
17	with a peace officer as evidenced by a written statement from a
18	licensed physician.
19	(j) Information supplied to the department relating to the
20	applicant's criminal history is for the confidential use of the
21	department and may not be disclosed to any person or used as
22	evidence in a legal proceeding, including an immigration
23	proceeding.
24	Sec. 521.234. FEES. The department shall set the amount of
25	the fee for:
26	(1) issuance or renewal of a Texas conditional
27	driver's permit; and

(2) issuance of a provisional Texas conditional 1 2 driver's permit and Texas conditional instruction permit. Sec. 521.235. EXPIRATION. (a) Each Texas conditional 3 driver's permit issued under this subchapter expires one year after 4 5 the date of issuance. 6 (b) Each provisional Texas conditional driver's permit and 7 Texas conditional instruction permit issued under this subchapter 8 expires on the 18th birthday of the permit holder. Sec. 521.236. FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY REQUIREMENT. (a) A 9 Texas conditional driver's permit is invalid if, on request of a 10 peace officer, the permit holder is unable to provide evidence of 11 12 financial responsibility for a motor vehicle the permit holder is operating that complies with Subchapter D, Chapter 601. 13 14 (b) A holder of a Texas conditional driver's permit who 15 cannot produce proof of financial responsibility as required by this section commits an offense punishable under Section 521.457. 16 SECTION 2. Section 521.457, Transportation Code, is amended 17 by adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows: 18 19 (a-1) A person who holds a Texas conditional driver's permit issued under Subchapter K-1 commits an offense if the person 20 operates a motor vehicle on a highway and is unable to provide 21 evidence of financial responsibility for a vehicle the permit 22 holder is operating, as required under Section 521.236. 23 24 SECTION 3. Not later than January 1, 2016, the Department of 25 Public Safety of the State of Texas shall: 26 (1) adopt the rules necessary to implement Subchapter 27 K-1, Chapter 521, Transportation Code, as added by this Act; and

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(2) create the application form required by Section
521.233, Transportation Code, as added by this Act.
