2	relating to a pilot project for complaints filed with certain state
3	boards or agencies.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 154, Occupations Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 154.059 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 154.059. DISMISSAL OF CERTAIN COMPLAINTS. (a)
8	Notwithstanding any other law, the board shall dismiss, with
9	prejudice for want of prosecution, a complaint filed with the board
10	against a license holder if:
11	(1) the complaint is pending with the board and has not
12	been referred to the State Office of Administrative Hearings;
13	(2) the license holder files a motion to dismiss the
14	complaint with the board; and
15	(3) the complaint was filed with the board more than 12
16	months before the date the motion to dismiss the complaint was
17	<u>filed.</u>
18	(b) Not later than December 31, 2016, the board shall submit
19	a report to the governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of the
20	house of representatives that contains:
21	(1) the number and types of complaints dismissed under
22	this section; and
23	(2) the amount of time each complaint was pending with

the board before the complaint was dismissed.

- 3 (d) This subsection and Subsection (b) expire January 1,
- 4 2017.
- 5 SECTION 2. Subchapter F, Chapter 1001, Occupations Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 1001.256 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 1001.256. DISMISSAL OF CERTAIN COMPLAINTS. (a)
- 8 Notwithstanding any other law, the board shall dismiss, with
- 9 prejudice for want of prosecution, a complaint filed with the board
- 10 against a license holder if:
- 11 (1) the complaint is pending with the board and has not
- 12 been referred to the State Office of Administrative Hearings;
- 13 (2) the license holder files a motion to dismiss the
- 14 complaint with the board; and
- 15 (3) the complaint was filed with the board more than 12
- 16 months before the date the motion to dismiss the complaint was
- 17 filed.
- 18 (b) Not later than December 31, 2016, the board shall submit
- 19 a report to the governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of the
- 20 house of representatives that contains:
- 21 (1) the number and types of complaints dismissed under
- 22 this section; and
- 23 (2) the amount of time each complaint was pending with
- 24 the board before the complaint was dismissed.
- 25 (c) This subsection and Subsection (a) expire August 31,
- 26 2016.
- 27 (d) This subsection and Subsection (b) expire January 1,

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1 2017.

- 2 SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply to a
- 3 complaint filed with a state agency that is pending on the effective
- 4 date of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
