H.B. No. 4179

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the creation of the Williamson County Municipal Utility District No. 32; granting a limited power of eminent domain; 3 providing authority to issue bonds; providing authority to impose 4 5 assessments, fees, and taxes. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 SECTION 1. Subtitle F, Title 6, Special District Local Laws 7 Code, is amended by adding Chapter 7935 to read as follows: 8 9 CHAPTER 7935. WILLIAMSON COUNTY MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT NO. 32 SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS 10 Sec. 7935.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter: 11 12 (1) "Board" means the district's board of directors. 13 (2) "Commission" means the Texas Commission on 14 Environmental Quality. 15 (3) "Director" means a board member. 16 (4) "District" means the Williamson County Municipal Utility District No. 32. 17 18 Sec. 7935.002. NATURE OF DISTRICT. The district is a municipal utility district created under Section 59, Article XVI, 19 20 Texas Constitution. 21 Sec. 7935.003. CONFIRMATION AND DIRECTORS' ELECTION REQUIRED. The temporary directors shall hold an election to 22 23 confirm the creation of the district and to elect five permanent directors as provided by Section 49.102, Water Code. 24

Sec. 7935.004. CONSENT OF MUNICIPALITY REQUIRED. 1 The 2 temporary directors may not hold an election under Section 7935.003 until each municipality in whose corporate limits or 3 extraterritorial jurisdiction the district is located 4 has consented by ordinance or resolution to the creation of the 5 district and to the inclusion of land in the district. 6 7 Sec. 7935.005. FINDINGS OF PUBLIC PURPOSE AND BENEFIT. (a)

8 The district is created to serve a public purpose and benefit.

9 (b) The district is created to accomplish the purposes of:

10 <u>(1) a municipal utility district as provided by</u> 11 general law and Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution; and

12 (2) Section 52, Article III, Texas Constitution, that 13 relate to the construction, acquisition, improvement, operation, 14 or maintenance of macadamized, graveled, or paved roads, or 15 improvements, including storm drainage, in aid of those roads.

16 <u>Sec. 7935.006. INITIAL DISTRICT TERRITORY.</u> (a) The 17 <u>district is initially composed of the territory described by</u> 18 <u>Section 2 of the Act enacting this chapter.</u>

19 (b) The boundaries and field notes contained in Section 2 of 20 the Act enacting this chapter form a closure. A mistake made in the 21 field notes or in copying the field notes in the legislative process 22 does not affect the district's:

24 (2) right to issue any type of bond for the purposes 25 for which the district is created or to pay the principal of and 26 interest on a bond;

27 (3) right to impose a tax; or

2	SUBCHAPTER B. BOARD OF DIRECTORS
3	Sec. 7935.051. GOVERNING BODY; TERMS. (a) The district is
4	governed by a board of five elected directors.
5	(b) Except as provided by Section 7935.052, directors serve
6	staggered four-year terms.
7	Sec. 7935.052. TEMPORARY DIRECTORS. (a) On or after the
8	effective date of the Act enacting this chapter, the owner or owners
9	of a majority of the assessed value of the real property in the
10	district may submit a petition to the commission requesting that
11	the commission appoint as temporary directors the five persons
12	named in the petition. The commission shall appoint as temporary
13	directors the five persons named in the petition.
14	(b) Temporary directors serve until the earlier of:
15	(1) the date permanent directors are elected under
16	Section 7935.003; or
17	(2) the fourth anniversary of the effective date of
18	the Act enacting this chapter.
19	(c) If permanent directors have not been elected under
20	Section 7935.003 and the terms of the temporary directors have
21	expired, successor temporary directors shall be appointed or
22	reappointed as provided by Subsection (d) to serve terms that
23	expire on the earlier of:
24	(1) the date permanent directors are elected under
25	Section 7935.003; or
26	(2) the fourth anniversary of the date of the
27	appointment or reappointment.

1 (d) If Subsection (c) applies, the owner or owners of a 2 majority of the assessed value of the real property in the district may submit a petition to the commission requesting that the 3 commission appoint as successor temporary directors the five 4 5 persons named in the petition. The commission shall appoint as successor temporary directors the five persons named in the 6 7 petition. 8 SUBCHAPTER C. POWERS AND DUTIES 9 Sec. 7935.101. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES. The district has 10 the powers and duties necessary to accomplish the purposes for which the district is created. 11 12 Sec. 7935.102. MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT POWERS AND DUTIES. The district has the powers and duties provided by the 13 general law of this state, including Chapters 49 and 54, Water Code, 14 applicable to municipal utility districts created under Section 59, 15 Article XVI, Texas Constitution. 16 Sec. 7935.103. AUTHORITY FOR ROAD PROJECTS. Under Section 17 52, Article III, Texas Constitution, the district may design, 18 acquire, construct, finance, issue bonds for, improve, operate, 19 maintain, and convey to this state, a county, or a municipality for 20 operation and maintenance macadamized, graveled, or paved roads, or 21 22 improvements, including storm drainage, in aid of those roads. Sec. 7935.104. ROAD STANDARDS AND REQUIREMENTS. (a) A road 23 24 project must meet all applicable construction standards, zoning and subdivision requirements, and regulations of each municipality in 25 26 whose corporate limits or extraterritorial jurisdiction the road 27 project is located.

1 (b) If a road project is not located in the corporate limits 2 or extraterritorial jurisdiction of a municipality, the road project must meet all applicable construction standards, 3 subdivision requirements, and regulations of each county in which 4 5 the road project is located. (c) If the state will maintain and operate the road, the 6 Texas Transportation Commission must approve the plans and 7 specifications of the road project. 8 9 The district shall convey the public roads constructed (d) 10 by or on behalf of the district under Section 7935.103 to Williamson County for ownership, operation, and maintenance by the county. 11 12 After the 12th anniversary of the date the county accepts conveyance of the roads, the district shall maintain the public 13 roads located in the district, except that the county shall 14 15 maintain the east-west arterial roadway located in the district north of the San Gabriel River and south of State Highway 29. The 16 17 district's obligation to maintain the public roads located in the district ceases if all of the territory of the district is annexed 18 19 by a municipality. Sec. 7935.105. COMPLIANCE WITH MUNICIPAL CONSENT ORDINANCE 20 OR RESOLUTION. The district shall comply with all applicable 21 22 requirements of any ordinance or resolution that is adopted under Section 54.016 or 54.0165, Water Code, and that consents to the 23 creation of the district or to the inclusion of land in the 24 25 district. 26 SUBCHAPTER D. GENERAL FINANCIAL PROVISIONS 27 Sec. 7935.151. ELECTIONS REGARDING TAXES OR BONDS. (a) The

1	district may issue, without an election, bonds and other
2	obligations secured by:
3	(1) revenue other than ad valorem taxes; or
4	(2) contract payments described by Section 7935.153.
5	(b) The district must hold an election in the manner
6	provided by Chapters 49 and 54, Water Code, to obtain voter approval
7	before the district may impose an ad valorem tax or issue bonds
8	payable from ad valorem taxes.
9	(c) The district may not issue bonds payable from ad valorem
10	taxes to finance a road project unless the issuance is approved by a
11	vote of a two-thirds majority of the district voters voting at an
12	election held for that purpose.
13	Sec. 7935.152. OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE TAX. (a) If
14	authorized at an election held under Section 7935.151, the district
15	may impose an operation and maintenance tax on taxable property in
16	the district in accordance with Section 49.107, Water Code.
17	(b) The board shall determine the tax rate. The rate may not
18	exceed the rate approved at the election.
19	Sec. 7935.153. CONTRACT TAXES. (a) In accordance with
20	Section 49.108, Water Code, the district may impose a tax other than
21	an operation and maintenance tax and use the revenue derived from
22	the tax to make payments under a contract after the provisions of
23	the contract have been approved by a majority of the district voters
24	voting at an election held for that purpose.
25	(b) A contract approved by the district voters may contain a
26	provision stating that the contract may be modified or amended by
27	the board without further voter approval.

1 SUBCHAPTER E. BONDS AND OTHER OBLIGATIONS 2 Sec. 7935.201. AUTHORITY TO ISSUE BONDS AND OTHER 3 OBLIGATIONS. The district may issue bonds or other obligations payable wholly or partly from ad valorem taxes, impact fees, 4 revenue, contract payments, grants, or other district money, or any 5 combination of those sources, to pay for any authorized district 6 7 purpose. 8 Sec. 7935.202. TAXES FOR BONDS. At the time the district issues bonds payable wholly or partly from ad valorem taxes, the 9 board shall provide for the annual imposition of a continuing 10 direct ad valorem tax, without limit as to rate or amount, while all 11 12 or part of the bonds are outstanding as required and in the manner provided by Sections 54.601 and 54.602, Water Code. 13 14 Sec. 7935.203. BONDS FOR ROAD PROJECTS. At the time of 15 issuance, the total principal amount of bonds or other obligations issued or incurred to finance road projects and payable from ad 16 17 valorem taxes may not exceed one-fourth of the assessed value of the real property in the district. 18 19 SECTION 2. 15 SECTION 3. (a) The legal notice of the intention to 16 introduce this Act, setting forth the general substance of this 17 Act, has been published as provided by law, and the notice and a 18 copy of this Act have been furnished to all persons, agencies, 19 officials, or entities to which they are required to be furnished 20 under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and Chapter 313, 21 Government Code.

(b) The governor, one of the required recipients, has submitted the notice and Act to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality.

(c) The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has filed its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor, the lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of

1 representatives within the required time.

(d) All requirements of the constitution and laws of this
state and the rules and procedures of the legislature with respect
to the notice, introduction, and passage of this Act are fulfilled
and accomplished.

6 SECTION 4. (a) If this Act does not receive a two-thirds 7 vote of all the members elected to each house, Subchapter C, Chapter 8 7935, Special District Local Laws Code, as added by Section 1 of 9 this Act, is amended by adding Section 7935.106 to read as follows:

10 <u>Sec. 7935.106. NO EMINENT DOMAIN POWER. The district may</u> 11 <u>not exercise the power of eminent domain.</u>

12 (b) This section is not intended to be an expression of a 13 legislative interpretation of the requirements of Section 17(c), 14 Article I, Texas Constitution.

15 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
