## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the creation of Simonton Management District No. 1; providing authority to issue bonds; providing authority to impose 3 assessments, fees, or taxes. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Subtitle C, Title 4, Special District Local Laws 7 Code, is amended by adding Chapter 3934 to read as follows: CHAPTER 3934. SIMONTON MANAGEMENT DISTRICT NO. 1 8 9 SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS Sec. 3934.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter: 10 (1) "Board" means the district's board of directors. 11 12 (2) "City" means the City of Simonton. 13 (3) "County" means Fort Bend County. 14 (4) "Director" means a board member. (5) "District" means the Simonton Management District 15 16 No. 1. Sec. 3934.002. NATURE OF DISTRICT. The Simonton Management 17 District No. 1 is a special district created under Section 59, 18 19 Article XVI, Texas Constitution. Sec. 3934.003. PURPOSE; DECLARATION OF INTENT. (a) The 20 21 creation of the district is essential to accomplish the purposes of Sections 52 and 52-a, Article III, and Section 59, Article XVI, 22 23 Texas Constitution, and other public purposes stated in this chapter. By creating the district and in authorizing the city, the 24

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1	county, and other political subdivisions to contract with the
2	district, the legislature has established a program to accomplish
3	the public purposes set out in Section 52-a, Article III, Texas
4	Constitution.
5	(b) The creation of the district is necessary to promote,
6	develop, encourage, and maintain employment, commerce,
7	transportation, housing, tourism, recreation, the arts,
8	entertainment, economic development, safety, and the public
9	welfare in the district.
10	(c) This chapter and the creation of the district may not be
11	interpreted to relieve the city or the county from providing the
12	level of services provided as of the effective date of the Act
13	enacting this chapter to the area in the district. The district is
14	created to supplement and not to supplant city or county services
15	provided in the district.
16	Sec. 3934.004. FINDINGS OF BENEFIT AND PUBLIC PURPOSE.
17	(a) The district is created to serve a public use and benefit.
18	(b) All land and other property included in the district
19	will benefit from the improvements and services to be provided by
20	the district under powers conferred by Sections 52 and 52-a,
21	Article III, and Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and
22	other powers granted under this chapter.
23	(c) The creation of the district is in the public interest
24	and is essential to further the public purposes of:
25	(1) developing and diversifying the economy of the
26	<pre>state;</pre>
27	(2) eliminating unemployment and underemployment; and

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1	(3) developing or expanding transportation and
2	commerce.
3	(d) The district will:
4	(1) promote the health, safety, and general welfare of
5	residents, employers, potential employees, employees, visitors,
6	and consumers in the district, and of the public;
7	(2) provide needed funding for the district to
8	preserve, maintain, and enhance the economic health and vitality of
9	the district territory as a community and business center;
10	(3) promote the health, safety, welfare, and enjoyment
11	of the public by providing pedestrian ways and by landscaping and
12	developing certain areas in the district, which are necessary for
13	the restoration, preservation, and enhancement of scenic beauty;
14	and
15	(4) provide for water, wastewater, drainage, road, and
16	recreational facilities for the district.
17	(e) Pedestrian ways along or across a street, whether at
18	grade or above or below the surface, and street lighting, street
19	landscaping, parking, and street art objects are parts of and
20	necessary components of a street and are considered to be a street
21	or road improvement.
22	(f) The district will not act as the agent or
23	instrumentality of any private interest even though the district
24	will benefit many private interests as well as the public.
25	Sec. 3934.005. INITIAL DISTRICT TERRITORY. (a) The
26	district is initially composed of the territory described by
27	Section 2 of the Act enacting this chapter.

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1	(b) The boundaries and field notes contained in Section 2 of
2	the Act enacting this chapter form a closure. A mistake in the
3	field notes or in copying the field notes in the legislative process
4	does not affect the district's:
5	(1) organization, existence, or validity;
6	(2) right to issue any type of bonds for the purposes
7	for which the district is created or to pay the principal of and
8	interest on the bonds;
9	(3) right to impose or collect an assessment or tax; or
10	(4) legality or operation.
11	Sec. 3934.006. APPLICABILITY OF MUNICIPAL MANAGEMENT
12	DISTRICTS LAW. Except as otherwise provided by this chapter,
13	Chapter 375, Local Government Code, applies to the district.
14	Sec. 3934.007. CONSTRUCTION OF CHAPTER. This chapter shall
15	be liberally construed in conformity with the findings and purposes
16	stated in this chapter.
17	SUBCHAPTER B. BOARD OF DIRECTORS
18	Sec. 3934.051. GOVERNING BODY; TERMS. (a) The district is
19	governed by a board of five voting directors who serve staggered
20	terms of four years, with two or three directors' terms expiring
21	June 1 of each odd-numbered year.
22	(b) The board by resolution may change the number of voting
23	directors on the board if the board determines that the change is in
24	the best interest of the district. The board may not consist of
25	fewer than five or more than nine voting directors.
26	Sec. 3934.052. APPOINTMENT OF VOTING DIRECTORS. The mayor
27	and members of the governing body of the city shall appoint voting

1	directors from persons recommended by the board. A person is
2	appointed if a majority of the members of the governing body,
3	including the mayor, vote to appoint that person.
4	Sec. 3934.053. NONVOTING DIRECTORS. The board may appoint
5	nonvoting directors to serve at the pleasure of the voting
6	<u>directors.</u>
7	Sec. 3934.054. QUORUM. For purposes of determining the
8	requirements for a quorum of the board, the following are not
9	<u>counted:</u>
10	(1) a board position vacant for any reason, including
11	death, resignation, or disqualification;
12	(2) a director who is abstaining from participation in
13	a vote because of a conflict of interest; or
14	(3) a nonvoting director.
15	Sec. 3934.055. COMPENSATION. A director is entitled to
16	receive fees of office and reimbursement for actual expenses as
17	provided by Section 49.060, Water Code. Sections 375.069 and
18	375.070, Local Government Code, do not apply to the board.
19	Sec. 3934.056. INITIAL VOTING DIRECTORS. (a) The initial
20	board consists of the following voting directors:

27	(b) Of the initial directors, the terms of directors

H.B. No. 4192 1 appointed for positions one through three expire June 1, 2017, and the terms of directors appointed for positions four and five expire 2 3 June 1, 2019. (c) Section 3934.052 does not apply to this section. 4 SUBCHAPTER C. POWERS AND DUTIES 5 Sec. 3934.101. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES. The district has 6 7 the powers and duties necessary to accomplish the purposes for 8 which the district is created. Sec. 3934.102. IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS AND SERVICES. 9 The 10 district may provide, design, construct, acquire, improve, relocate, operate, maintain, or finance an improvement project or 11 12 service using any money available to the district, or contract with a governmental or private entity to provide, design, construct, 13 acquire, improve, relocate, operate, maintain, or finance an 14 improvement project or service authorized under this chapter or 15 Chapter 375, Local Government Code. 16 17 Sec. 3934.103. DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION POWERS. The district, using money available to the district, may exercise the 18 19 powers given to a development corporation under Chapter 505, Local Government Code, including the power to own, operate, acquire, 20 construct, lease, improve, or maintain a project under that 21 22 chapter. Sec. 3934.104. NONPROFIT CORPORATION. (a) The board by 23 resolution may authorize the creation of a nonprofit corporation to 24 assist and act for the district in implementing a project or 25 26 providing a service authorized by this chapter.

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(b) The nonprofit corporation:

H.B. No. 4192 (1) has each power of and is considered to be a local 1 2 government corporation created under Subchapter D, Chapter 431, 3 Transportation Code; and 4 (2) may implement any project and provide any service authorized by this chapter. 5 6 (c) The board shall appoint the board of directors of the 7 nonprofit corporation. The board of directors of the nonprofit 8 corporation shall serve in the same manner as the board of directors of a local government corporation created under Subchapter D, 9 Chapter 431, Transportation Code, except that a board member is not 10 required to reside in the district. 11 12 Sec. 3934.105. AGREEMENTS; GRANTS. (a) As provided by Chapter 375, Local Government Code, the district may make an 13 14 agreement with or accept a gift, grant, or loan from any person. 15 (b) The implementation of a project is a governmental function or service for the purposes of Chapter 791, Government 16 17 Code. Sec. 3934.106. LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICES. To protect the 18 19 public interest, the district may contract with a qualified party, including the county or the city, to provide law enforcement 20 services in the district for a fee. 21 Sec. 3934.107. MEMBERSHIP IN CHARITABLE ORGANIZATIONS. The 22 district may join and pay dues to a charitable or nonprofit 23 24 organization that performs a service or provides an activity consistent with the furtherance of a district purpose. 25 26 Sec. 3934.108. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. (a) The district may engage in activities that accomplish the economic development 27

## 1 purposes of the district.

2 (b) The district may establish and provide for the 3 administration of one or more programs to promote state or local 4 economic development and to stimulate business and commercial 5 activity in the district, including programs to:

(1) make loans and grants of public money; and

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(2) provide district personnel and services.

8 (c) The district may create economic development programs 9 and exercise the economic development powers provided to 10 municipalities by Chapter 380, Local Government Code.

Sec. 3934.109. PARKING FACILITIES. (a) The district may acquire, lease as lessor or lessee, construct, develop, own, operate, and maintain parking facilities or a system of parking facilities, including lots, garages, parking terminals, or other structures or accommodations for parking motor vehicles off the streets and related appurtenances.

17 (b) The district's parking facilities serve the public 18 purposes of the district and are owned, used, and held for a public 19 purpose even if leased or operated by a private entity for a term of 20 years.

21 (c) The district's parking facilities are parts of and 22 necessary components of a street and are considered to be a street 23 or road improvement.

24 (d) The development and operation of the district's parking
 25 facilities may be considered an economic development program.

26 Sec. 3934.110. ANNEXATION OF LAND. The district may annex 27 land as provided by Subchapter J, Chapter 49, Water Code.

1	Sec. 3934.111. APPROVAL BY CITY. Section 375.207, Local
2	Government Code, does not apply to the district.
3	Sec. 3934.112. NO EMINENT DOMAIN POWER. The district may
4	not exercise the power of eminent domain.
5	SUBCHAPTER D. GENERAL FINANCIAL PROVISIONS; ASSESSMENTS
6	Sec. 3934.151. DISBURSEMENTS AND TRANSFERS OF MONEY. The
7	board by resolution shall establish the number of directors'
8	signatures and the procedure required for a disbursement or
9	transfer of district money.
10	Sec. 3934.152. MONEY USED FOR IMPROVEMENTS OR SERVICES.
11	The district may acquire, construct, finance, operate, or maintain
12	any improvement or service authorized under this chapter or Chapter
13	375, Local Government Code, using any money available to the
14	district.
15	Sec. 3934.153. PETITION REQUIRED FOR FINANCING SERVICES AND
16	IMPROVEMENTS WITH ASSESSMENTS. (a) The board may not finance a
17	service or improvement project with assessments under this chapter
18	unless a written petition requesting that service or improvement
19	has been filed with the board.
20	(b) A petition filed under Subsection (a) must be signed by
21	the owners of a majority of the assessed value of real property in
22	the district subject to assessment according to the most recent
23	certified tax appraisal roll for the county.
24	Sec. 3934.154. ASSESSMENTS; LIENS FOR ASSESSMENTS.
25	(a) The board by resolution may impose and collect an assessment
26	for any purpose authorized by this chapter in all or any part of the
27	district.

H.B. No. 4192 1 (b) An assessment, a reassessment, or an assessment 2 resulting from an addition to or correction of the assessment roll by the district, penalties and interest on an assessment or 3 reassessment, an expense of collection, and reasonable attorney's 4 5 fees incurred by the district: 6 (1) are a first and prior lien against the property 7 assessed; 8 (2) are superior to any other lien or claim other than a lien or claim for county, school district, or municipal ad valorem 9 10 taxes; and (3) are the personal liability of and a charge against 11 12 the owners of the property even if the owners are not named in the 13 assessment proceedings. 14 (c) The lien is effective from the date of the board's 15 resolution imposing the assessment until the date the assessment is paid. The board may enforce the lien in the same manner that the 16 17 board may enforce an ad valorem tax lien against real property. (d) The board may make a correction to or deletion from the 18 19 assessment roll that does not increase the amount of assessment of any parcel of land without providing notice and holding a hearing in 20 the manner required for additional assessments. 21 Sec. 3934.155. TAX AND ASSESSMENT ABATEMENTS. The district 22 may designate reinvestment zones and may grant abatements of 23 24 district taxes or assessments on property in the zones. SUBCHAPTER E. TAXES AND BONDS 25 26 Sec. 3934.201. ELECTIONS REGARDING TAXES AND BONDS. (a) The district may issue, without an election, bonds, notes, and 27

1	other obligations secured by:
2	(1) revenue other than ad valorem taxes; or
3	(2) contract payments described by Section 3934.203.
4	(b) The district must hold an election in the manner
5	provided by Subchapter L, Chapter 375, Local Government Code, to
6	obtain voter approval before the district may impose an ad valorem
7	tax or issue bonds payable from ad valorem taxes.
8	(c) Section 375.243, Local Government Code, does not apply
9	to the district.
10	(d) All or any part of any facilities or improvements that
11	may be acquired by a district by the issuance of its bonds may be
12	submitted as a single proposition or as several propositions to be
13	voted on at the election.
14	Sec. 3934.202. OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE TAX. (a) If
15	authorized by a majority of the district voters voting at an
16	election held in accordance with Section 3934.201, the district may
17	impose an operation and maintenance tax on taxable property in the
18	district in accordance with Section 49.107, Water Code, for any
19	district purpose, including to:
20	(1) maintain and operate the district;
21	(2) construct or acquire improvements; or
22	(3) provide a service.
23	(b) The board shall determine the tax rate. The rate may not
24	exceed the rate approved at the election.
25	(c) Section 49.107(h), Water Code, does not apply to the
26	district.
27	Sec. 3934.203. CONTRACT TAXES. (a) In accordance with

1 Section 49.108, Water Code, the district may impose a tax other than 2 an operation and maintenance tax and use the revenue derived from the tax to make payments under a contract after the provisions of 3 the contract have been approved by a majority of the district voters 4 5 voting at an election held for that purpose. 6 (b) A contract approved by the district voters may contain a 7 provision stating that the contract may be modified or amended by 8 the board without further voter approval. 9 Sec. 3934.204. AUTHORITY TO BORROW MONEY AND TO ISSUE BONDS AND OTHER OBLIGATIONS. (a) The district may borrow money on terms 10 determined by the board. Section 375.205, Local Government Code, 11 12 does not apply to a loan, line of credit, or other borrowing from a bank or financial institution secured by revenue other than ad 13 14 valorem taxes. 15 (b) The district may issue bonds, notes, or other obligations payable wholly or partly from ad valorem taxes, 16 17 assessments, impact fees, revenue, contract payments, grants, or other district money, or any combination of those sources of money, 18 19 to pay for any authorized district purpose. The district may pledge ad valorem taxes to bonds, notes, or other obligations only as 20 authorized by the Texas Constitution. 21 22 (c) The limitation on the outstanding principal amount of bonds, notes, and other obligations provided by Section 49.4645, 23 24 Water Code, does not apply to the district. Sec. 3934.205. TAXES FOR BONDS. At the time the district 25 26 issues bonds payable wholly or partly from ad valorem taxes, the board shall provide for the annual imposition of a continuing 27

1 direct annual ad valorem tax, without limit as to rate or amount, for each year that all or part of the bonds are outstanding as 2 3 required and in the manner provided by Sections 54.601 and 54.602, Water Code. 4 5 Sec. 3934.206. CITY NOT REQUIRED TO PAY DISTRICT OBLIGATIONS. Except as provided by Section 375.263, Local 6 7 Government Code, the city is not required to pay a bond, note, or 8 other obligation of the district.

Thence, Northerly, along a westerly line of said 200.15 acre tract and the easterly line of said F.M. 1489, 365 feet, more or less to a westerly corner of said 200.15 acre tract, the beginning of a curve;

Thence, Northerly, along a westerly line of said 200.15 acre

1 tract and the easterly line of said F.M. 1489, 430 feet, more or 2 less, along the arc of a tangent curve to the right, having a radius 3 of 5,679.65 feet, to a westerly corner of said 200.15 acre tract;

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Thence, Northerly, along a westerly line of said 200.15 acre tract and the easterly right-of-way line of said F.M. 1489, 1,801 feet, more or less, to a point for corner, said point being at the approximate ETJ Line of Simonton, the beginning of a curve;

17 SECTION 3. (a) The legal notice of the intention to introduce this Act, setting forth the general substance of this 18 19 Act, has been published as provided by law, and the notice and a copy of this Act have been furnished to all persons, agencies, 20 officials, or entities to which they are required to be furnished 21 under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and Chapter 313, 22 23 Government Code.

(b) The governor, one of the required recipients, has
 submitted the notice and Act to the Texas Commission on
 Environmental Quality.

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(c) The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has filed

1 its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor, 2 lieutenant governor, and speaker of the house of representatives 3 within the required time.

4 (d) The general law relating to consent by political
5 subdivisions to the creation of districts with conservation,
6 reclamation, and road powers and the inclusion of land in those
7 districts has been complied with.

8 (e) All requirements of the constitution and laws of this 9 state and the rules and procedures of the legislature with respect 10 to the notice, introduction, and passage of this Act have been 11 fulfilled and accomplished.

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
