CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Citizens of the United States owe an incalculable

2 debt to the nation's military personnel, who have served so

3 valiantly and sacrificed so much in this country's behalf; and

WHEREAS, The current U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs

5 policy of suspending hospital and outpatient care services to

incarcerated veterans is especially detrimental to those

7 individuals in need of mental health care; some of these men and

8 women are being held in state hospitals awaiting restoration of

9 competency in order to stand trial, and the scarcity of timely

10 access to services in these facilities can prolong their detention;

11 and

12 WHEREAS, Veterans suffer disproportionately from

13 post-traumatic stress disorder, which is often worsened by

14 incarceration and can lead to depression and suicidal thoughts and

15 actions, and incarcerated veterans too often lack access to

16 treatment for this condition; and

17 WHEREAS, Improved coordination between the VA and state and

18 local jurisdictions would enable eligible veterans to continue to

19 receive mental health care and other VA services; in addition, VA

20 reimbursement provided to secure mental health facilities for

21 forensic beds and services would ensure better medical treatment

22 for veterans and help alleviate the legal delays frequently

23 experienced by incarcerated veterans with mental health issues; and

24 WHEREAS, Veterans of the U.S. armed forces have earned the

- 1 lasting gratitude of all Americans for their devotion to duty, and
- 2 they are deserving of prompt and compassionate assistance in their
- 3 time of need; now, therefore, be it
- 4 RESOLVED, That the 84th Legislature of the State of Texas
- 5 hereby respectfully urge the Congress of the United States to
- 6 require the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs to provide VA
- 7 services to incarcerated veterans detained in state hospitals; and,
- 8 be it further
- 9 RESOLVED, That Congress consider expanding such services to
- 10 all incarcerated veterans; and, be it further
- 11 RESOLVED, That the Texas secretary of state forward official
- 12 copies of this resolution to the president of the United States, to
- 13 the president of the Senate and the speaker of the House of
- 14 Representatives of the United States Congress, and to all the
- 15 members of the Texas delegation to Congress with the request that
- 16 this resolution be entered in the Congressional Record as a
- 17 memorial to the Congress of the United States of America.
