HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, It is the responsibility of the federal government

2 to fully maintain the security of the Texas-Mexico international

fully maintain the security of the Texas-Mexico international

7 WHEREAS, An unprotected border facilitates drug smuggling

8 and human trafficking and opens the door to spillover violence from

9 criminal cartels; moreover, the ease with which members of

10 terrorist organizations can enter the country poses a grave threat

11 to homeland security; and

WHEREAS, The federal government's failure to prevent illegal

13 entry has shifted much of the responsibility to the State of Texas;

14 consequently, budget writers must weigh the costs of border

15 security against the expense of other state services; during the

16 2012-2013 budget cycle, Texas spent \$221,600,000 on border security

17 operations, and in the 2014-2015 budget, the state appropriated

18 \$343,300,000 for such expenditures; and

19 WHEREAS, Furthermore, Governor Rick Perry transferred

20 \$38,700,000 from a state law enforcement fund in 2014 to pay for

21 deploying additional Department of Public Safety officers and

22 National Guard troops along the Texas-Mexico border; and

23 WHEREAS, The executive branch and the United States Congress
