HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Our nation is fortunate to have sons and daughters 2 whose love of country is such that they are willing to risk their 3 lives in its defense, and they are truly deserving of the utmost 4 respect and gratitude; and

5 WHEREAS, Legions of Americans stepped forward to serve their 6 nation in the aftermath of September 11, 2001, and their unwavering 7 resolve to combat terrorism in the Global War on Terror helped 8 ensure the safety of millions of people back home and around the 9 globe; and

10 WHEREAS, Almost 7,000 U.S. service members, including 600 11 Texans, have died in the war to date, and countless more American 12 troops have been wounded; sharing in those sacrifices have been 13 their families and friends; and

WHEREAS, Under Chapter 443, Government Code, and rules of the State Preservation Board, a portion of the north Capitol grounds is available for new monuments, subject to legislative approval, specified procedural requirements, the provision of funding from private donors, conformity to certain size and design limitations and parameters, and completion on a timely basis; and
