## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, Our nation is fortunate to have sons and daughters
- 2 whose love of country is such that they are willing to risk their
- 3 lives in its defense, and they are truly deserving of the utmost
- 4 respect and gratitude; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Legions of Americans stepped forward to serve their
- 6 nation in the aftermath of September 11, 2001, and their unwavering
- 7 resolve to combat terrorism in the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan
- 8 helped ensure the safety of millions of people back home and around
- 9 the globe; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Over the course of both wars, almost 7,000 U.S.
- 11 service members, including 600 Texans, died, and countless more
- 12 American troops were wounded; sharing in those sacrifices were
- 13 their families and friends; and
- WHEREAS, Under Chapter 443, Government Code, and rules of the
- 15 State Preservation Board, a portion of the north Capitol grounds is
- 16 available for new monuments, subject to legislative approval,
- 17 specified procedural requirements, the provision of funding from
- 18 private donors, conformity to certain size and design limitations
- 19 and parameters, and completion on a timely basis; and
- WHEREAS, Members of the Texas Legislature find that a
- 21 commemorative monument recognizing those Texans who served during
- 22 the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan would be a worthy addition to the
- 23 Capitol grounds; now, therefore, be it
- 24 RESOLVED, That the 84th Legislature of the State of Texas

- 1 hereby authorize the State Preservation Board, subject to state law
- 2 and rules of the board, to approve and permit the construction of a
- 3 monument at the state Capitol Complex, at a site outside the
- 4 historic Capitol grounds, honoring Texans who served in the wars in
- 5 Iraq and Afghanistan as part of the U.S. armed forces and their
- 6 families; and, be it further
- 7 RESOLVED, That the Texas secretary of state forward an

- 9 State Preservation Board.
