## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, As in previous sessions, bills have been introduced 2 in both chambers of the 84th Texas Legislature to modify current 3 statutes prescribing how legally required notices are posted and 4 advertised to the general public; and

5 WHEREAS, Abundant testimony against these measures in past public hearings has cited statistics that public notice placed on 6 7 the Internet would not reach a large number of Texans, demonstrated problems with archiving Internet notices, raised questions about 8 9 removing oversight and reducing transparency, and questioned the cost-effectiveness of posting notices on the Internet or through 10 11 social media; there has also been testimony that publishing public 12 notice on the Internet or through social media would be efficient and cost-effective and would 13 increase audience reach and 14 transparency; and

15 WHEREAS, It is incumbent on the State of Texas to ensure that 16 public notification about vital information be efficient and 17 effective, and the issue of posting and advertising public notices 18 on the Internet merits further examination; now, therefore, be it

19 RESOLVED, That the 84th Legislature of the State of Texas 20 hereby request the lieutenant governor and the speaker of the house 21 of representatives to create a joint interim committee to study the 22 issue of advertising public notices; and, be it further

23 RESOLVED, That the committee's proceedings and operations be 24 governed by such general rules and policies for joint interim
