- WHEREAS, The cruise operations in the home port of Galveston 2 have an enormous economic impact on Texas; the city hosted more than 900,000 passenger and crew visits in 2013, which accounted for \$1.2 3 billion in direct spending; in addition, the industry was 4

- 11 the area, with more than 150 miles of Gulf shoreline, also harbors

- most from the North American cruise industry; Florida operates five 15
- 16 ports, including Port Canaveral, Port
- Jacksonville, Miami, and Tampa, and California is home to four, in 17
