## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, The framers of the Constitution established the
- 2 United States as a representative democracy that relies on civic
- 3 engagement; and
- 4 WHEREAS, A fundamental element of effective democracy is the
- 5 principle that all eligible citizens should participate in fair and
- 6 open elections; however, the Rio Grande Valley has historically low
- 7 voter turnout; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Rio Grande Valley residents increased their
- 9 registration rates by 72 percent between 2010 and 2014;
- 10 nevertheless, only about 24 percent of registered voters cast a
- 11 ballot in the 2014 mid-term election; and
- 12 WHEREAS, In order to reach those who have not fully embraced
- 13 their rights and responsibilities as citizens, the community must
- 14 expand opportunities for voter education and nonpartisan voter
- 15 registration; vital contributions in this regard can be made by
- 16 grassroots organizations, by the media, by educational, cultural,
- 17 and religious institutions, and by other entities in both the
- 18 public and private sector; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Across the Rio Grande Valley, there is an urgent
- 20 need to increase participation in the electoral process; now,
- 21 therefore, be it
- 22 RESOLVED, That the 84th Legislature of the State of Texas
- 23 hereby designate September as Valley Voter Awareness Month; and, be
