CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, The Gulf Coast plays a vital role in the Texas
- 2 economy, and the oyster ranks among the most valuable resources of
- 3 the region as a popular food and as the mainstay of an important
- 4 harvesting and processing industry; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Texas coastal waters and bays face continual, often
- 6 harsh challenges, which can negatively impact the viability of the
- 7 oysters there; these challenges include natural phenomena such as
- 8 drought, storms, disease, and algae blooms, as well as man-made
- 9 destruction caused by oil spills and other incidents; now,
- 10 therefore, be it
- 11 RESOLVED, That the 84th Legislature of the State of Texas
- 12 hereby request that the lieutenant governor and the speaker of the
- 13 house of representatives create a joint interim committee to study
- 14 oyster resource management in Texas waterways, including the
- 15 growing, transplanting, and harvesting of oysters; and, be it
- 16 further
- 17 RESOLVED, That the study specifically develop
- 18 recommendations to better protect, develop, and propagate oysters
- 19 in order to support and enhance the oyster industry; and, be it
- 20 further
- 21 RESOLVED, That the joint interim committee be composed of
- 22 five members of the Texas Senate, three of whom represent districts
- 23 adjacent to oyster-producing bay systems, and five members of the
- 24 Texas House of Representatives, three of whom represent districts

- 1 adjacent to oyster-producing bay systems; and, be it further
- 2 RESOLVED, That the chair or co-chairs of the committee be
- 3 chosen from among the members representing districts with
- 4 significant oyster production; and, be it further
- 5 RESOLVED, That the committee submit a full report, including
- 6 findings and recommendations, to the 85th Texas Legislature in
- 7 January 2017; and, be it further
- 8 RESOLVED, That the committee's proceedings and operations be
- 9 governed by such general rules and policies for interim committees
- 10 as the 84th Texas Legislature may adopt.
