A JOINT RESOLUTION

proposing a constitutional amendment to limit the purposes for 1

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4

5 SECTION 1. Section 7-a, Article VIII, Texas Constitution,

is amended to read as follows: 6

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Sec. 7-a. Subject to legislative appropriation, allocation, and direction, all net revenues remaining after payment 8 9 of all refunds allowed by law and expenses of collection derived from motor vehicle registration fees, and all taxes, except gross 10

production and ad valorem taxes, on motor fuels and lubricants used 11

12 to propel motor vehicles over public roadways, shall be used for the

sole purpose of acquiring rights-of-way $for and[\tau]$ constructing, 13

maintaining, and policing [such] public roadways, and for the

administration of such laws as may be prescribed by the Legislature

16 pertaining to the supervision of traffic and safety on such roads;

17 [and for the payment of the principal and interest on county and

road district bonds or warrants voted or issued prior to January 2, 18

1939, and declared eligible prior to January 2, 1945, for payment 19

out of the County and Road District Highway Fund under existing law; 20

provided, however, that one-fourth (1/4) of such net revenue from 21

the motor fuel tax shall be allocated to the Available School Fund; 22

23 and, provided, however, that the net revenue derived by counties

from motor vehicle registration fees shall never be less than the 24

- 1 maximum amounts allowed to be retained by each County and the
- 2 percentage allowed to be retained by each County under the laws in
- 3 effect on January 1, 1945. Nothing contained <u>in this section</u>
- 4 [herein] shall be construed as authorizing the pledging of the
- 5 State's credit for any purpose.
- 6 SECTION 2. The following temporary provision is added to
- 7 the Texas Constitution:
- 8 <u>TEMPORARY PROVISION</u>. (a) This temporary provision applies
- 9 to the constitutional amendment proposed by the 84th Legislature,
- 10 Regular Session, 2015, to limit the purposes for which revenue from
- 11 motor vehicle registration fees and taxes on motor fuels and
- 12 <u>lubricants may be used.</u>
- (b) The changes to Section 7-a, Article VIII, of this
- 14 constitution made by the amendment apply only in connection with a
- 15 state fiscal biennium that begins on or after September 1, 2017.
- (c) This temporary provision expires September 1, 2018.
- 17 SECTION 3. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be
- 18 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 3, 2015.
- 19 The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against the
- 20 proposition: "The constitutional amendment to limit the purposes
- 21 for which revenue from motor vehicle registration fees and taxes on
- 22 motor fuels and lubricants may be used."
