RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, On December 25, 2015, many Texans will join in

2 worship and in fellowship as they celebrate the joyous occasion

3 known as Christmas; and

4 WHEREAS, Observed by Christians all across the world,

5 Christmas commemorates the birth of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whose

6 arrival on earth is heralded as a promise of salvation for

7 humankind; after more than two millennia, Christ's example

8 continues to serve as a model of generosity and compassion and as a

9 guiding presence in the lives of countless people; and

10 WHEREAS, Although Christmas has a longstanding history in the

11 United States, the breadth of its observance has grown considerably

12 since the earliest days of our nation's founding; the Christmas

13 tradition familiar to us today arose during the 19th century, and

14 most markedly in the years of rapid industrialization following the

15 Civil War; at a time of national unrest and uncertainty, a holiday

16 reminiscent of a simpler life, suffused by the fundamental spirit

17 of peace and goodwill, offered comfort and spoke to the most fervent

18 prayers of all Americans; by 1870, the observance of Christmas had

19 become so widespread that the day was declared a national holiday;

23 lights, of tinsel-strewn trees, and of such confections as

24 gingerbread and eggnog; many present-day customs are derived from
