- 1 WHEREAS, Nacogdoches lost one of its most admired civic
- 2 leaders with the passing of former mayor James E. Raney on June 21,
- 3 2014, at the age of 74; and
- WHEREAS, The son of James Nathan Raney and Maurine Key Raney,
- 5 James Raney was born in Madisonville on February 25, 1940; the
- 6 family relocated to Huntsville in 1950, and he graduated from
- 7 Huntsville High School; after completing his bachelor's degree, he
- 8 served his country in the United States Army and Army Reserve for
- 9 six years, attaining the rank of first lieutenant; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Mr. Raney married his childhood sweetheart, the
- 11 former Sandra Hill, on January 27, 1962, and they became the proud
- 12 parents of two daughters, Penny and Julie; in 1966, the couple moved
- 13 to Nacogdoches, where they opened the Varsity Book Store, an
- 14 enterprise they continued to run for nearly four decades; Mr. Raney
- 15 was an especially kind and caring employer, and he was a mentor and
- 16 role model to many young people; following the death of his wife in
- 17 2009, he was fortunate enough to find love again with the former
- 18 Vida Lynne Kowalski, and they wed on June 23, 2012; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Deeply committed to his community, Mr. Raney
- 20 devoted much of his life to public service; he was a trustee of the
- 21 Nacogdoches Independent School District for nine years and served
- 22 as its president, and during a decadelong tenure on the city
- 23 commission, he served for two years as mayor; moreover, he was a
- 24 member of the Criminal Justice Task Force Commission, and Governor

- 1 Bill Clements also appointed him twice as chair of the Deep East
- 2 Texas Council of Governments Regional Review Committee; he was
- 3 later named to the board of the Angelina and Neches River Authority
- 4 by Governor Rick Perry; and
- 5 WHEREAS, This dynamic Texan gave freely of his time and
- 6 talents as master of Milam Lodge No. 2, as a member of all York Rite
- 7 Bodies, as a 32nd degree Scottish Rite Mason, and as a Shriner; in
- 8 addition, he belonged to Safari Club International, and he was a
- 9 life member of both the Texas State Rifle Association and the
- 10 National Rifle Association; he was on the board of the Nacogdoches
- 11 Rotary Club, and he served as president of the Nacogdoches Booster
- 12 Club; moreover, he was a member of the Sons of the Republic of
- 13 Texas; a faithful Episcopalian, he was a senior warden at Christ
- 14 Church, where he served on the Vestry; and
- WHEREAS, Setting an inspiring example of warmth, compassion,
- 16 and integrity, James Raney was a true gentleman, and he
- 17 demonstrated good will and generosity toward all; his legacy of
- 18 service will continue to resonate in his hometown and beyond, and
- 19 those who were fortunate enough to know him will forever remember
- 20 the tremendous positive influence he had on their lives; now,
- 21 therefore, be it
- 22 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 84th Texas
- 23 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the memory of James E. Raney and
- 24 extend sincere condolences to the members of his family: to his
- 25 wife, Vida Lynne Kowalski Raney; to his daughters, Penny Raney and
- 26 Julie Raney Williams and her husband, Kirby; to his grandchildren,
- 27 Kate, Claire, and Dray Schmidt and Sam, Avery, and Zoe Williams; to

- 1 his brother, State Representative John N. Raney, and his wife,
- 2 Elizabeth; to his sisters, Theda Raney Flournoy and Eileen Thrash
- 3 and her husband, John; and to his other relatives and many friends;
