1 WHEREAS, Proud citizens of Laredo are gathering in Austin to 2 celebrate Laredo Day at the State Capitol on January 27, 2015; and 3 WHEREAS, Originally known as San Agustin de Laredo, the city was founded in 1755 as an outpost of the Spanish empire; it later

5 belonged to Mexico, after that country gained independence from

Spain in 1821, and served as the capital of the short-lived Republic 6

7 of the Rio Grande; Laredo became part of Texas in 1846 and was

subsequently chosen as the seat of Webb County; and 8

9 WHEREAS, From its earliest days, Laredo was an important crossing on the Rio Grande and a trading center for livestock, 10 11 hides, and wool; its role in international trade expanded with the 12 arrival of the railroad in 1881 and with the development of the Zona Libre, or free trade zone, along the border between the United 13 14 States and Mexico; its economy was further helped by coal mining, the introduction of onion farming, and the discovery of rich oil and 15

16 gas fields; and WHEREAS, Today, this bustling gateway city is the largest 17 inland port along the U.S.-Mexico border and one of the top U.S. 18 Customs districts in the nation, and its diverse economy benefits 19 from the retail, hospitality, import and export, and petroleum 20 21 industries; the city handles more than a third of all trade between 22 the United States and Mexico; Laredo is also a focus for higher 23 education in the Rio Grande Valley, as the home to Texas A&M 24 International University, two campuses of Laredo Community

- 1 College, and an extension campus of The University of Texas Health
- 2 Science Center at San Antonio; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Visitors and residents alike may explore such area
- 4 attractions as the historic San Agustin Cathedral, the Republic of
- 5 the Rio Grande Museum, and the Laredo Center for the Arts, while 40
- 6 blocks of import vendors along San Bernardo Avenue draw shoppers
- 7 from near and far; in addition, Laredo is home to Washington's
- 8 Birthday Celebration, a 118-year-old, month-long event that
- 9 includes a carnival, a colonial pageant, a jalapeno festival, and a
- 10 parade; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Heirs to a rich history and a vibrant international
- 12 culture, the citizens of Laredo may indeed take great pride in their
- 13 city's two and a half centuries of progress and achievement; now,
- 14 therefore, be it
- RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 84th Texas
- 16 Legislature hereby recognize January 27, 2015, as Laredo Day at the
- 17 State Capitol and extend to the visiting delegation sincere best
