1 WHEREAS, Mary Jean Moloney of Arlington retired from Atmos
2 Energy on December 31, 2014, drawing to a close a notable career in
3 the natural gas industry that has spanned four decades; and

4 WHEREAS, A native of Detroit, Michigan, Mrs. Moloney
5 received her bachelor's degree in family consumer sciences from
6 Wayne State University and went on to earn a master's degree in
7 business administration from the University of Dallas; and

8 WHEREAS, Mrs. Moloney embarked on her career in the energy
9 industry in 1974, when she joined Lone Star Gas as a consumer
10 information specialist in Greenville; after working as a department
11 supervisor in Fort Worth, she moved on to serve as district manager
12 in both Carrollton and Arlington, as a business development
13 manager, and as director of business development; when the company
14 merged with TXU in 1997, she became a district manager and then an
15 area manager, and she is retiring as manager of public affairs for
16 Atmos Energy in Arlington; and

17 WHEREAS, While meeting the many demands of her professional
18 life, Mrs. Moloney has found time to give back to her community
19 through her service on the boards of Texas Health Arlington
20 Memorial Hospital, the Arlington Financial Corporation, the City of
21 Arlington Electrical Code Board of Appeals, and the Arlington Board
22 of Realtors Community Service Foundation; in addition, she has been
23 a Richard Greene Scholarship Program mentor and has advised the
24 Junior League of Arlington, The University of Texas at Arlington

1 School of Social Work Advisory Council, the Arlington Housing
2 Authority, and the Arlington Chamber of Commerce; and

3 WHEREAS, Mrs. Moloney has also given generously of her time
4 and talents to the Hurst-Euless-Bedford Chamber of Commerce, the
5 Northeast Leadership Forum, the Grand Prairie Chamber of Commerce,
6 the Greater Irving-Las Colinas Chamber of Commerce, the US Pan
7 Asian American Chamber of Commerce, the March of Dimes, the
8 Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex Chapter of the American Red Cross, and
9 the Fort Worth Consortium Private Industry Council, as well as to
10 the United Way of Tarrant County, Grand Prairie United Charities,
11 and SafeHaven of Tarrant County; she holds the distinction of being
12 the first female member of the Rotary Club of Arlington; and

13 WHEREAS, In all her endeavors, this esteemed Texan enjoys the
14 love and support of her husband of 23 years, Tim Moloney; together,
15 she and her husband have mentored four young people through the Big
16 Brothers Big Sisters program; and

17 WHEREAS, Mary Jean Moloney's consummate professionalism and
18 unswerving commitment to excellence have greatly benefited the
19 natural gas customers of North Texas and earned her the respect and
20 admiration of her peers, and she may indeed reflect with pride on a
21 career well spent as she embarks on the next exciting chapter of her
22 life; now, therefore, be it
