RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, Many notable citizens of Lubbock are visiting Austin
- 2 on February 24, 2015, to pay tribute to their city's rich heritage
- 3 and to celebrate Lubbock Day at the State Capitol; and
- WHEREAS, A thriving region of the state, the Lubbock area is
- 5 one of the oldest inhabited places in Texas; archeologists have
- 6 discovered evidence of some 12,000 years of continuous habitation
- 7 at the Lubbock Lake Landmark site, a national historic and state
- 8 archeological preserve; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The City of Lubbock was incorporated on March 16,
- 10 1909, and railroads stimulated the city's growth as a trade center;
- 11 residents also wanted the benefits of an institution of higher
- 12 learning, and when legislation creating Texas Technological
- 13 College was passed in 1923, the site selection committee, impressed
- 14 by the enthusiasm and hospitality of local citizens, chose Lubbock
- 15 for its location; and
- WHEREAS, Today a community of almost 240,000 people, Lubbock
- 17 is home to the Texas Tech University System and its flagship campus
- 18 as well as to two other public universities and a public community
- 19 college; together, they draw more than 53,000 students to the city
- 20 each year, making a significant impact on the local economy;
- 21 approximately 10,000 young Texans graduate in Lubbock each year,
- 22 and 30 percent of residents over the age of 25 hold at least a
- 23 bachelor's degree; and
- 24 WHEREAS, Fostering a dynamic business environment, Lubbock

- 1 has a regional labor force of more than 207,000, and the cost of
- 2 doing business continues to rank as one of the lowest in the nation,
- 3 due to affordable land, wage rates, electric and natural gas
- 4 utilities, property taxes, and living expenses; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Lubbock is consistently recognized by national
- 6 organizations for its business-friendly atmosphere; it was ranked
- 7 seventh in the 2014 Forbes list of "Opportunity Cities" based on low
- 8 cost of living, cultural offerings, and the strength of the
- 9 business community; in addition, it has been named a top city for
- 10 professional women and for young entrepreneurs seeking to start a
- 11 business; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Noted for its diverse economy, the city draws its
- 13 strength from agribusiness, manufacturing, and commerce, as well as
- 14 from educational facilities and medical infrastructure considered
- 15 the most extensive to be found between Dallas and Phoenix; with the
- 16 growth of cotton culture on the High Plains, Lubbock has become one
- 17 of the world's primary centers for the processing of cottonseed and
- 18 hybrid grain sorghum seed; and
- 19 WHEREAS, The economy is deeply rooted in cotton farming, and
- 20 Lubbock remains home to the world's largest contiguous cotton
- 21 patch; the area also features several major, award-winning wineries
- 22 and vineyards, which produce more than 70 percent of all the state's
- 23 wine grapes; and
- 24 WHEREAS, This vibrant city also offers a wealth of
- 25 recreational opportunities and cultural institutions, among them
- 26 the Lubbock Symphony Orchestra, the Lubbock Civic Ballet, the
- 27 Museum and Planetarium of Texas Tech University, and the Silent

- 1 Wings Museum; plans are well advanced for a new, state-of-the-art
- 2 performing arts center to be named after local legend and Rock 'n'
- 3 Roll Hall of Famer Buddy Holly; and
- 4 WHEREAS, City leaders meticulously planned infrastructure to
- 5 create neighborhood parks and ensure the smooth flow of traffic;
- 6 surrounded by five major highways, Lubbock is nicknamed the "Hub
- 7 City," and it aims to continue that legacy through the eventual
- 8 Interstate 27 expansion, a mayoral initiative to relieve congestion
- 9 on other Texas highways that run through town; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Those desiring a glimpse of the frontier can find it
- 11 in the restored structures at the Ranching Heritage Center, a
- 12 15-acre site tracing the evolution of ranch architecture and the
- 13 history of the cattle industry; the region's history is also
- 14 celebrated at the Bayer Museum of Agriculture; and
- WHEREAS, A host of talented musicians have hailed from the
- 16 Lubbock area, among them Buddy Holly, Roy Orbison, the Maines
- 17 family, Virgil Johnson and the Velvets, Waylon Jennings, Tanya
- 18 Tucker, Joe Ely, Jimmie Dale Gilmore, Pat Green, and Butch Hancock;
- 19 their rich and diverse contributions have earned Lubbock and West
- 20 Texas state designation as the official "Music Crossroads of
- 21 Texas"; and
- 22 WHEREAS, Lubbock's thriving business community is
- 23 represented by the largest business federation on the Texas South
- 24 Plains, the Lubbock Chamber of Commerce, which has promoted the
- 25 prosperity of the Lubbock area for more than a century; achieving
- 26 great success from its earliest days, it recruited out-of-state
- 27 farmers to till the fertile soils of the Llano Estacado, secured

- 1 railroad service, founded the South Plains Fair, and drafted and
- 2 delivered the application that would result in the establishment of
- 3 Texas Technological College, which today thrives as the heart of
- 4 the Texas Tech University System; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The chamber was also instrumental in establishing
- 6 Lubbock Preston Smith International Airport and Reese Air Force
- 7 Base, as well as the revolutionary market-driven Chamber Employer
- 8 Health Plan, which is now a national model; moreover, its efforts
- 9 have been key in the development of outstanding transportation
- 10 infrastructure; committed to revitalizing the community and its
- 11 downtown, the chamber oversees the efforts of Imagine Lubbock
- 12 Together, a private-public partnership; it is the nation's first
- 13 and only chamber to be twice 5-Star Accredited and twice named
- 14 Chamber of the Year; and
- WHEREAS, The delegation visiting the Capitol today includes
- 16 proud members of the chamber's 40th Leadership Lubbock Class, who
- 17 represent the future business and community leaders of Lubbock; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Truly keeping faith with the founders of their West
- 19 Texas community, the citizens of Lubbock are renowned for their
- 20 friendliness and warmth as well as their hardiness and
- 21 determination, and they have helped to build a vital urban center
- 22 that serves not only a large part of West Texas but also eastern New
- 23 Mexico; now, therefore, be it
- 24 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 84th Texas
- 25 Legislature hereby recognize February 24, 2015, as Lubbock Day at
- 26 the State Capitol and extend to the members of the visiting
- 27 delegation and all their fellow citizens sincere appreciation for

1 the bright luster they add to the Lone Star State.
