- 1 WHEREAS, Proud residents of the Mid-Valley region of Texas
- 2 are gathering in Austin on February 11, 2015, to celebrate
- 3 Mid-Valley Day at the State Capitol; and
- WHEREAS, Located in eastern Hidalgo County in the Rio Grande
- 5 Valley, the Mid-Valley region includes the towns of Alamo, Donna,
- 6 Mercedes, Pharr, Progreso, Progreso Lakes, San Juan, and Weslaco;
- 7 this area is a center for agribusiness, with farmers producing
- 8 sugarcane, grains, and citrus fruit such as grapefruits and
- 9 oranges; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The city of Alamo is located in proximity to the
- 11 Santa Ana National Wildlife Refuge, which encompasses more than
- 12 2,000 acres of protected land and is home to a wide array of animals
- 13 and plants; in addition, the town boasts a birding information
- 14 center and the popular Alamo Central Park; and
- WHEREAS, Upholding the motto "the City with a Heart in the
- 16 Heart of the Rio Grande Valley," Donna serves as the location of the
- 17 Donna-Rio Bravo International Bridge, which helps to facilitate
- 18 shopping, tourism, and commercial trade to and from Mexico; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Mercedes has long been a major center for the
- 20 processing and marketing of livestock, cotton, and vegetables, and
- 21 it is also known for its boot makers and the shopping opportunities
- 22 at the Rio Grande Valley Premium Outlets; the annual Rio Grande
- 23 Valley Livestock Show and Rodeo draws more than 200,000 people to
- 24 town each year, and the event provides valuable scholarship funds

- 1 for 4-H and FFA students; and
- WHEREAS, Known as the Hub City of the Rio Grande Valley, Pharr
- 3 is home to the Pharr International Bridge, which for more than two
- 4 decades has served as a reliable passage for exported produce and
- 5 textiles; moreover, the town has been recognized as a Triple Crown
- 6 City in honor of national awards it has received for commitment to
- 7 historic preservation, economic development, and civic excellence;
- 8 and
- 9 WHEREAS, In addition to being centers for the sugarcane
- 10 business, Progreso and Progreso Lakes have been serving as gateways
- 11 to the Rio Grande Valley since the opening of the Progreso/Nuevo
- 12 Progreso International Bridge in 2003; and
- WHEREAS, Fast-growing San Juan is the home of the Basilica of
- 14 Our Lady of San Juan del Valle National Shrine, which attracts
- 15 multitudes of pilgrims from throughout the United States and
- 16 Mexico; the town hosts an annual Spring Fiesta and is the site of
- 17 numerous parks, including Liberty Park, with its flagpole monument
- 18 honoring those who have served in the U.S. armed forces; and
- 19 WHEREAS, The city of Weslaco has become a favorite
- 20 destination for tourists, golfers, retirees, and birders, and it is
- 21 the location of two important Texas A&M University research
- 22 stations; the annual Onion Fest celebrates the development of the
- 23 famous Texas 1015 onion in Weslaco, and this popular event brings
- 24 many visitors to the city; and
- WHEREAS, Throughout the Mid-Valley region, great emphasis is
- 26 placed on the value of education; the Science Academy of South Texas
- 27 in Mercedes consistently ranks among the top 100 on Newsweek's list

- 1 of "America's Best High Schools"; in addition, IDEA Public Schools,
- 2 a nonprofit network of charter schools with 26 campuses in the Rio
- 3 Grande Valley alone, is helping young Texans build a strong
- 4 foundation for future success; 99 percent of IDEA alumni go on to
- 5 enroll in a college or a university, and they graduate from those
- 6 institutions at five times the national average for students of
- 7 similar backgrounds; and
